Rococo Chinoiserie

In the eighteenth century Europe's enduring fascination with the distant and mysterious East manifested itself in the fanciful decorative idiom of chinoiserie.

The imagined charms of Cathay were rendered in whimsical and luxurious vignettes of a leisured existence beyond the confines of the known world. The style was a natural companion to the frivolity of the rococo, which delighted much of Europe during the middle decades of that century, and the published designs of artists such as the French painter Jean-Baptiste Pillement (1728-1803) became popular sources of ornament. British designers such as William Chambers (1723-1796) and Thomas Chippendale (1718-1779) also produced influential designs covering all aspects of fashionable life from pavilions, bridges and tea houses, to beds, chairs and mirrors.

By the middle of the century, the fashionable London pleasure gardens at Vauxhall and Ranelagh had several examples of chinoiserie architecture, which would later form a suitably fanciful backdrop for such pleasure-loving visitors as the Prince of Wales (later George IV) and Georgiana, Duchess of Devonshire; and, in 1762, Chambers completed the famous Chinese pagoda for the Augusta, Princess Dowager of Wales in Kew Gardens. The finest surviving interior of that time is the exuberant Chinese Room at Claydon House in

Buckinghamshire, adorned with plasterwork trellises, pavilions and tea parties.

The use of rococo chinoiserie ornament on silver

is most commonly found in Britain, with the finest examples produced during the 1750s and 60s. The fashionable pursuit of tea and coffee drinking provided a further context for chinoiserie, and other broadly 'exotic' motifs (including Indian and Turkish). Not only did the 'hot liquors' originate from non-European lands, but the extensive new equipage required

for the polite enjoyment of them often included imported Chinese porcelain. The elegant ceremonies surrounding the consumption of these drinks were an opportunity to demonstrate wealth, taste and accomplishment. That a scene depicting tea or coffee drinking should be included on one of these pots clearly indicates the importance of the practice and its luxurious connotations. Indeed, tea, coffee and chocolate-drinking is a common theme in many portraits of the period, such as William Hogarth's *Assembly at Wanstead House* (1728-31) and *The Strode Family* (1738). The use of such costly and fashionably-decorated silver pots would therefore have marked their owners as refined individuals of great means and consequence.

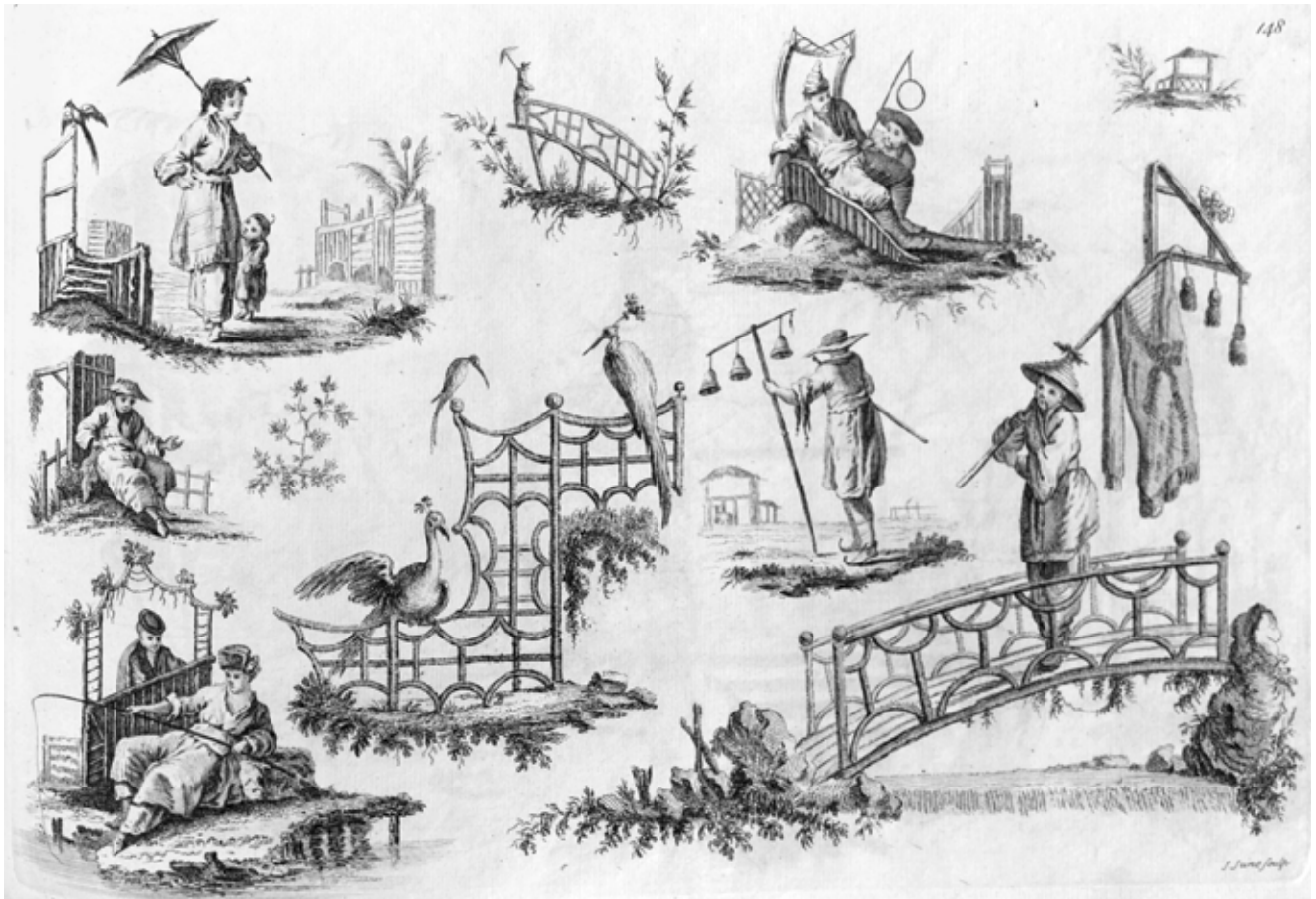

Engraved with a crest probably for ARMYTAGE, originally of Kirklees, Yorkshire.

The maker's mark shows only a pellet and C; the two most likely candidates are William Cripps or Francis Crump. The positioning of the pellet and shape of the 'C' point to Crump. A similarly decorated pot by Crump is held at the Leeds Museum & Galleries (Temple Newsam) 1991.0008.

The scenes are inspired by the designs of Jean Pillement (1728-1808), published by Robert Sayer, *The Ladies Amusement: The Whole Art of Japanning, Made Easy* (London 1762). The chaser has, clearly, taken inspiration from a single page from the book for this pot, adapting the vignettes to fit around the body of the pot.

James Lomax suggests that a single chaser specialising in Chinoiserie coffee pots was working for a group of silversmiths that included Charles Wright, Whipham and Wright, William Cripps and Francis Crump, *British Silver at Temple Newsam and Lotherton Hall* (Leeds 1992), p.133. However, The present lot was created a decade before the Temple Newsam example (1769), the following lot (London 1765) and an example by Whipham and Wright (London 1767) sold at Sotheby's 23 May 1991, ex-lot 280. In comparison, the pot is smaller making the decoration more intense.

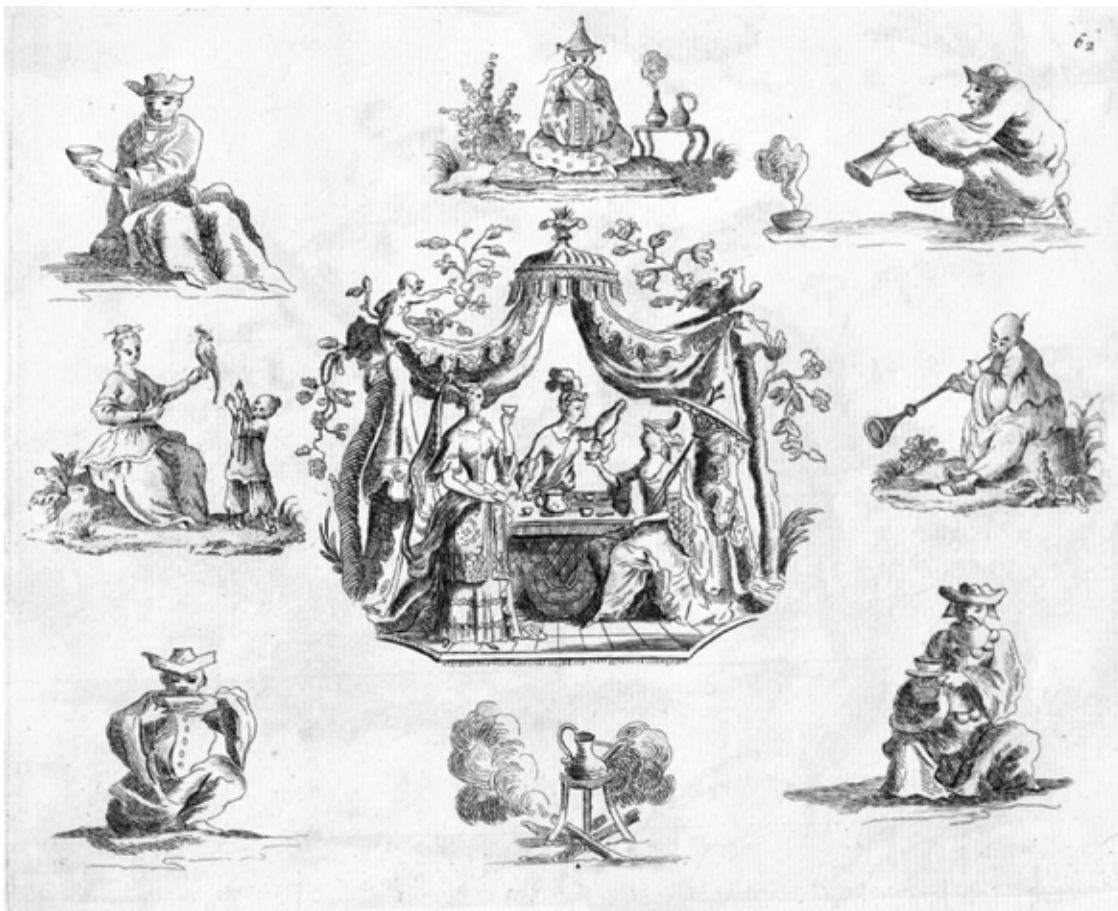

Please see the note to the previous lot regarding James Lomax's suggestion of a specialist Chinoiserie chaser working for several silversmiths including: Charles Wright, Whipham and Wright, William Cripps and Francis Crump, *British Silver at Temple Newsam and Lotherton Hall* (Leeds 1992), cat 135, p.132. To this list could now be added John Swift, he is noted by Grimwade as a maker "with an attractive repertoire of rococo and Chinoiserie motifs", *London Goldsmiths 1697-1837* (London 1990), p.675. By the mid-1760's, the chaser appears to have lessened his imitation of Pillement's designs and is being more interpretive and inventive. Although the landscapes of the present lot are in the Chinoiserie taste, with outswept tiled pagoda roofs and palm trees, the figures appear more European and the architectural scrolls have classic rococo brickwork and style.

This 'hybrid' style of decoration is much more similar to the one held at Temple Newsam by Crump and the Whipham & Wright example at Sotheby's (23 May 1991, ex-lotr 280): the taller, more elegant palm trees, the languid European figures dressed in eastern costume as well as the figural finials and the chased bands of roses and dahlias.

Ernest Steven was a holloware manufacturer, creating the famous 'Judge' ware. His wife Mary Steven (1869-1925) was involved with local charity and after her death Ernest Steven made several public donations in memory of his wife. He became the largest benefactor of Stourbridge, in 1929 he bought Studley Court estate and founded Mary Steven's Park.

In 1813, Louisa, Dowager Marchioness of Sligo married Sir William Scott, (b.1745) , judge of the High Court of Admiralty, Vicar-General of the Province of Canterbury and Member of Parliament for Oxford University at which he had formerly held several academic appointments. Sir William's shield is charged with an anchor possibly allusive to his father's activity as a Newcastle ship owner. It bears the quartered HOWE shield in pretence for Louisa, his second wife.

John Rennie (1761-1821) was commissioned to design and build the new bridge and a seven arched stone bridge was approved. The 9th of May 1811 Lord Thomas Dundas (1741-1820) laid the foundation stone of the bridge.

Lord Dundas was an MP for Richmond in 1763-68 and for Stirlingshire in 1768-1794. He was elevated to the peerage as Baron Dundas of Aske in August 1794, and was also Lord Lieutenant and Vice Admiral of Orkney and Shetland, Councillor of state to the Prince of Wales later George IV. In 1801 he commissioned the steamboat "Charlotte Dundas", regarded as the world's first practical steamboat, and the boat that demonstrated the practicality of steam power for ships.

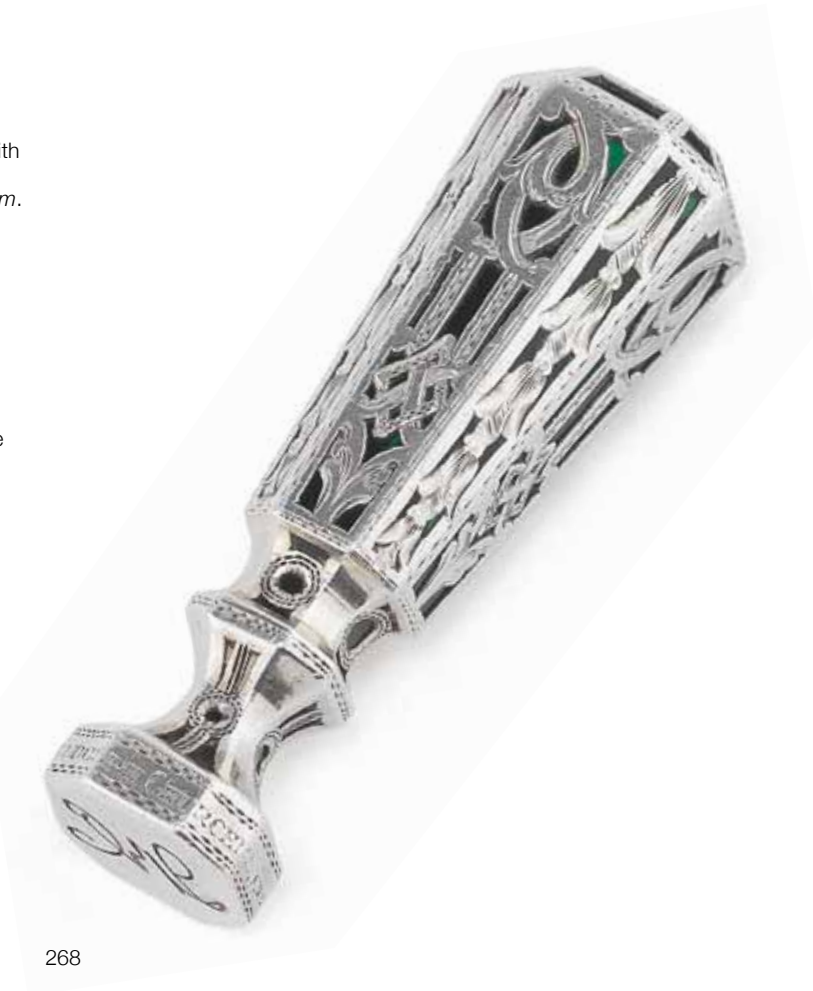

Boscobel House is in Shropshire, built in around 1632. The name is believed to be derived from the Italian phrase 'bosco bello' meaning 'in the midst of fair woods'. Boscobel House achieved notoriety as a hiding place of Catholics in times of peril.

During the Battle of Worcester, in 1651, the future King Charles II fled from Cromwell's army. His route to France was interrupted by a brief sojourn at Boscobel, hiding first in the tree now known as 'The Royal Oak', and the, by repute within a priest-hole in the house's attic.

Jacobite relics became popular during 1745 Jacobite Rebellion, Charles Stuart's attempt to regain the British throne. It was perhaps a Royalist memento or sign of support for the cause which was scuppered after the Jacobite's final defeat at the Battle of Culloden. Charles Stuart, much like his predecessor's, found himself escaping persecution under various guises before returning back to France in 1746.

The schooner *Peter H Crowell* 1873, owned by the shipping Line of the same name, left Norfolk Virginia, on the 3rd November 1893 for the Fall River with a cargo of coal. On November the 11th, she was seen by the British steamship *Sutherland*, on passage from Charleston to Bremen, 13 miles off Brodie Island with her decks swept, sails lost and all boats missing. Captain Proud brought his ship alongside and rescued Captain MacDonald and his six crew by means of lines, then landed them safely at Norfolk on the 13th.

Thomas Andrews joined Harland and Wolff, where his uncle was part owner, in 1889, as a premium apprentice and worked his way through the various departments, becoming Manager of the Construction works when he qualified in 1901. In 1907 he was appointed Head of the Drafting Department and as such was responsible, with William Pirrie and Alexander Carlisle, for the design of the new Super class of White Star liners *Olympic*, *Titanic* & *Britannic*.

His contributions to the design included recommendations for 46 lifeboats, a double hull and watertight bulkheads, none of which were finally adopted.

He was traveling on board the *Titanic* during the maiden voyage and after the collision advised Captain Smith that the damage was fatal. He heroically attempted to encourage passengers to board the few lifeboats, and to don lifejackets, and was seen throwing deck chairs overboard for flotation. One of the last to leave the ship, he perished at sea and his body was never recovered.

The Golden Globe Race 1968-69
 This event was sponsored by the Sunday Times to bring together various solo round the world sailing attempts. The newspaper offered the Golden Globe Trophy for the first person to make a solo, non-stop circumnavigation and an additional prize of £5,000 for the fastest passage. There were no size or qualification requirements and competitors could leave at any time between June/October 1968.

In the event, nine competitors took part, but all fell by the wayside and only Robin Knox Johnston, a young Merchant Navy Officer sailing in *Suhaili* a teak ketch he'd had constructed in India, completed the course becoming the first person to make a solo non-stop passage around the world. He arrived at Falmouth on the 22nd April 1969 after 313 days at sea.

Apart from Johnston's outstanding achievement, the event is now chiefly remembered for Frenchman Bernard Moitessier on *Joshua*. Deciding to carry on around the world after Cape Horn and eventually settling in Tahiti and the sad death of Donald Crowhurst on *Teighmouthe Electron* who committed suicide after misleading the organisers with false position reports whilst remaining in the Atlantic. Johnston donated his £5,000 prize money to Crowhurst's family.

Biggin Hill was rightly the best known of all Fighter Commands air stations from the Battle of Britain. It was from here 'in Britain's darkest hour' that young pilots flew between July and October 1940 in what was 'regarded by many' as the decisive battle of the war, with casualties affecting both pilots and ground-crew.

At the start of the Battle of Britain, Biggin Hill Sector formed part of No. 11 Group of R.A.F. Order of Battle (Fighter Command Units), it was home to 32 Squadron (Hurricane) and 610 Squadron (Spitfire), its close proximity to London ensured it was amongst the busiest Fighter Command Units. Towards the close of battle, 15th September 1940, it was home to 72 and 92 Squadrons, both flying Spitfires, as well as 141 Squadron in Defiants.

At the height of the Battle on 1st September, Biggin Hill was attacked twice, the second attack destroying the Operations Room and cutting all communications, although a temporary Operations Room was established in a local village shop. The day ended with Fighter Command suffering thirteen combat losses, German casualties are unknown.

The bell hung in the RAF fire station and no doubt during 1940 and for much of the rest of the war was tolled daily, often many times not only to herald the return of bruised and battered fighters, but also in response to the numerous enemy attacks on the airfield.

The renowned anatomist, Richard Owen was the first to describe the flightless moa to the western world in 1839 as “a struthious bird nearly, if not quite, equal in size to the ostrich, belonging to a heavier and more sluggish species”, from a single fragment of leg bone brought back from New Zealand by Dr John Rule. Within months of this bold declaration, more remains were discovered and brought back to London and Owen's reputation was secured. At this time, there were no confirmed sightings of living birds, although mariners at the end of the 18th century reported seeing birds along the coast of the south islands. Indeed, throughout the 19th century there were sporadic circumstantial reports of three toed footprints etc. and finally in 1878, the Otago Witness reported an actual encounter of a farmer with a bird “very much higher than an emu...more erect....silver grey with greenish streaks”.

The genus *Dinornis* comprises the slender species from north and south islands, including the largest bird ever known standing over twelve feet in height. The stockier forms are included in *Megalapteryx*, and *Euryapteryx* describes a broad billed characteristic. As many as thirty-seven species have been suggested from the various skeletal remains but the most recent estimate (J. Cracraft, 1976) identifies only thirteen. Nonetheless, a remarkable number of ratite species to inhabit such a small area when you consider the whole continent of Africa supports just one, the aforementioned ostrich. This may be explained by the fact that they were not all living concurrently, and that they were not predated upon by any large mammals. It is no surprise that their numbers rapidly declined as humans began to colonise New Zealand. By the turn of the 17th century most species were already extinct leaving only three surviving into recent times.

In 1483, Portuguese sailors became the first Europeans to encounter the Kongo people, as they voyaged along the west coast of Africa to search for new commercial routes to the East Indies. This mercantile expansion was accompanied by a religious zeal to convert the people they met, to Catholicism. By the early 16th Century, under the patronage of King Manuel I of Portugal, the king of Kongo himself was baptised as Alfonso I, and he in turn presided over many other converted local rulers. Missionaries reinforced Christian beliefs by the use of visual aids like crucifixes and carvings of St. Anthony (of Lisbon), which were made by local artists in metal, wood and ivory following Portuguese templates but with African features in traditional Kongo style.

It is very rare to find an ivory crucifix pendant, the more common form being that of a 'hand cross', the brass Christ applied to a wood frame, or a brass crucifix cast with integral figures in shallow relief. This example is close in style to ivory carvings from the Vili of the coastal Loango region, a Kikongo speaking group with a tradition of carving fine ivory staff finials, charms and whistles. We speculate this may have been worn by a local high ranking convert as a symbol of religious authority, or reinterpreted by a diviner as a charm to reinforce his mediator role between 'this world' and the 'spirit world'. The fine patination and strong Vili iconography suggest this dates to the 19th Century at least.

Gotha aircraft were used for bombing during WW1 but following the Treaty of Versailles all aircraft were destroyed. The factory did not recommence aircraft production until 1933, when a new design department was established under Albert Kalkert.

Their first aeroplane was the GO145 biplane trainer, which initially flew in 1934, followed by the two seat production version GO145C, powered by the Argus 10C air cooled engine, which went into service with the Luftwaffe in 1935. A successful design, it was produced under license by several other companies in Germany as well as Spain and Turkey.

Albert Kalkert had worked for LVG and Heinkel before accepting the post at Gotha and he stayed with the Company until 1940. His most successful design was the GO242 Transport glider, commissioned straight from the drawing board, over 1,500 were constructed in WW2.

The *Balmain Bug* was a generic term for a type of small pond yacht unique to Sydney Harbour. They evolved into a class of pond yacht denoted by the hull size, from six to 32 inches long on deck. The only class restriction was the length, no regulations controlled the size of the rig and most craft carried huge sail areas, balanced by very deep fin keels with lead bulb ballast. Eventually, the 12inch and 24inch classes evolved into the open water classes and active racing continued to be carried on into the 1950's.

After the introduction of a working Telegraph in 1839, the concept of International telegraphic communication gained ground, and an undersea cable was laid linking England to France in 1850. Proposals were offered for a Transatlantic Cable and a Company was formed in 1854 to lay a cable between Valentia Island in County Kerry to Heart's Content in Newfoundland. British and American Governments loaned the warships HMS *Agamemnon* and USS *Niagara* for the exercise and a first unsuccessful attempt was made in 1857.

The following year, after a couple of breakages, they finally succeeded in laying the complete cable and the first message was passed on August 16th.

Failures in the insulation resulted in deteriorating performance and in 1865/66 the steamship *Great Eastern* laid a further two new cables.

In order to circumvent the monopoly of the Transatlantic Cable, the Siemens brothers were persuaded in 1873 to launch the Direct United States Cable Company to construct and lay an independent cable from Ballinskelligs in County Kerry to Tor Bay in Nova Scotia and thence to Rye Beach in New Hampshire.

Siemens commissioned a special cable-laying paddle steamer the *CSFaraday* in 1873 and a year later it commenced operations, initially from Rye Beach to Tor Bay, and then from Ballinskelligs to Tor Bay, the entire cable being completed successfully in 1875.

The recovery location is in the middle of the Atlantic Ocean.

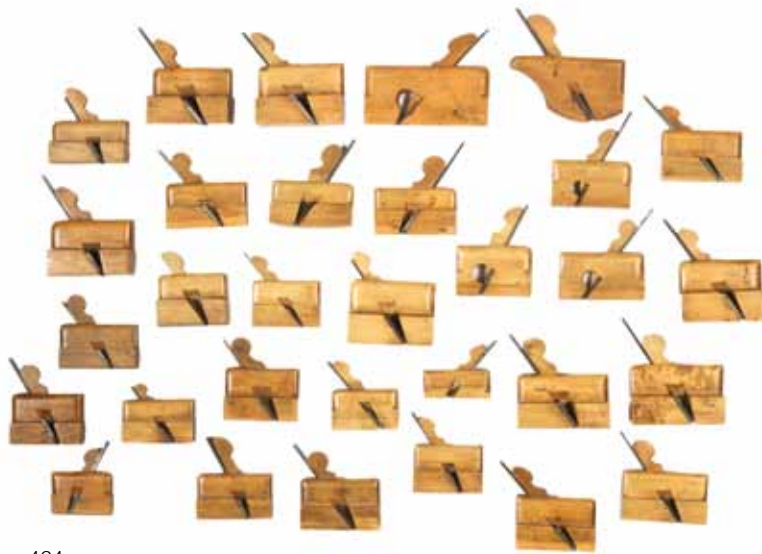

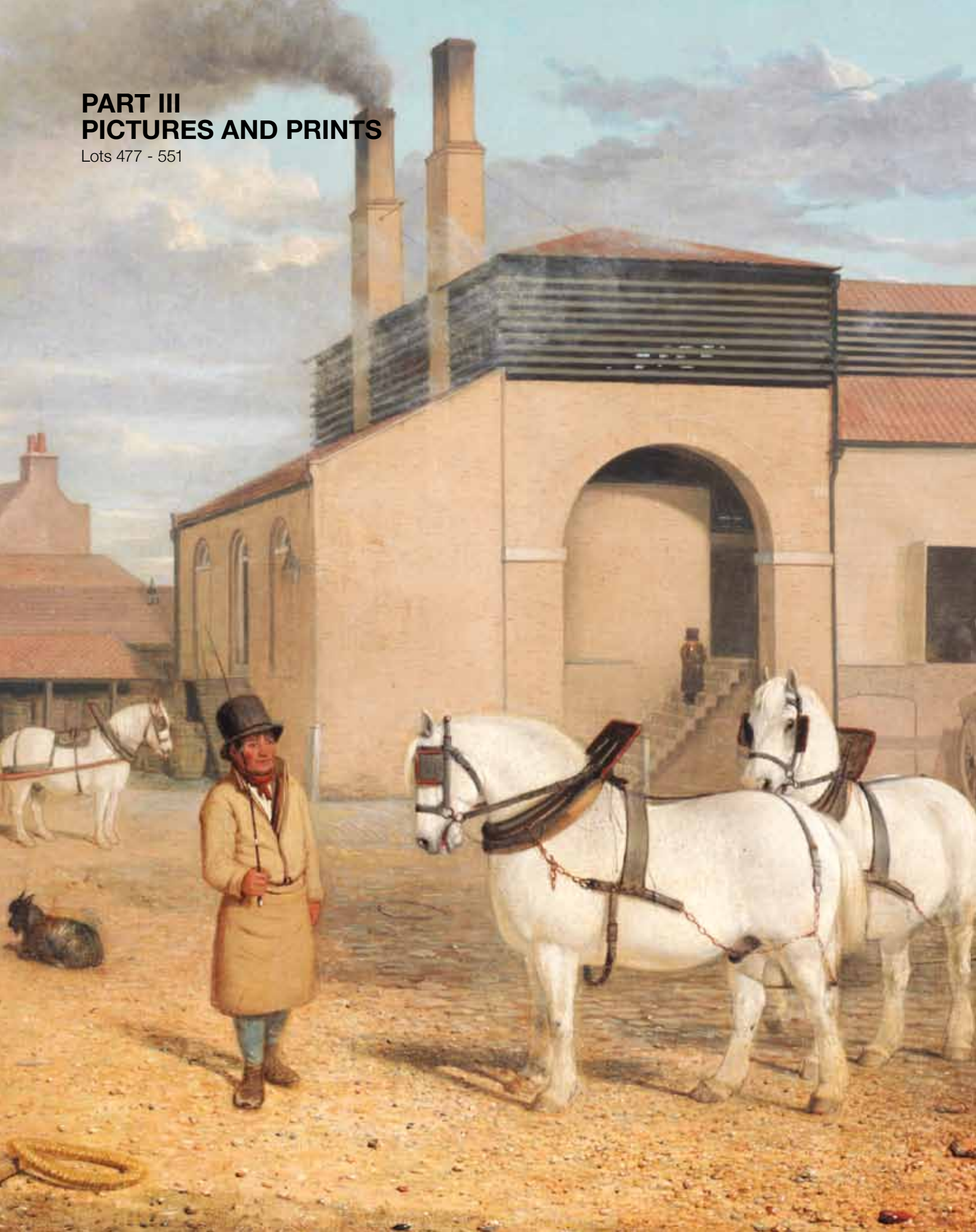

The Wurlitzer Model 1015 jukebox was the most famous jukebox of the American post-war era; it has become a symbol of the 1950s, representing the new life style after the Second World War.

The design of the jukebox was one of the major reasons why it became such a great success, the simple recognizable form, easy colourful lines and plenty of jukebox "flash" fitted right in to the new post-war society. It was also the first time that Wurlitzer used a proper advertisement campaign to promote it; a series of ads featuring full-page colourful illustrations appeared in popular magazines – Collier's, the Sunday Evening Post and Life etc, the campaign integrated Wurlitzer with "the American way of life".

The present lot is similar in its overall form to various kneehole and pedestal desk designs which appear in the *Gillows Estimate Sketch Books* at the very end of the 18th and very beginning of the 19th centuries. However the majority of these drawings appear to depict specific models which Gillows either refers to as *Architects' tables* or *Buroe writing tables* probably due, unlike the offered example with its plain surface, to their single or twin hinged (*double riser*) ratcheted tops.

One of the finest of these pedestal desks which incorporate a hinged top, albeit slightly earlier in date than the present version, is illustrated in S.E. Stuart, *Gillows of Lancaster and London, 1730-1840, Vol.II*, 2008, pl. GG28, p. 377. One notably refined feature that recurs on a large proportion of this type of furniture produced by Gillows, and also on the above model, is the arrangement inside the lower half of the secretaire of six hinged lidded compartments each inlaid with an oval ivory plaque engraved with four letters of the alphabet appearing immediately below a writing slide.

A pair of Regency oak library bergeres by Gillows, which sold at Christie's London, Hackwood Park, 20, 21 and 22 April 1998, lot 56, each bear a practically identical branded mark to that which features underneath the present lot. Consequently it seems fair to assume that the current library writing table, just as with the pair of chairs supplied in 1813, was originally commissioned for Hackwood Park by William Powlett, 2nd Baron Bolton (1782-1850) at or around the same time.

However some doubt is perhaps raised in the Christie's footnote through its reference to the bergeres as being 'the only apparent survivors' in terms of the Gillows furniture provided for Lord Bolton's Hackwood study in 1813. Despite this, it is very much feasible that the above table could have been supplied for a different room, such as the library, at Hackwood Park during the Regency period.

Major-General Charles George Gordon, CB (1833-1885) Gordon of Khartoum, was a British army officer and administrator.

He saw action in the Crimean War as an officer in the British Army and was given a Chevalier of the Legion of Honour by the Government of France in 1856 for his services. However his military reputation was made in China where he was placed in command of the "Ever Victorious Army," a force of Chinese soldiers led by European officers. In the early 1860s, Gordon and his men were instrumental in putting down the Taiping Rebellion regularly defeating much larger forces. For these accomplishments, he was given honours from both the Emperor of China and the British.

Gordon entered the service of the Khedive in 1873 with British government approval and later became the Governor-General of the Sudan, where he did much to suppress revolts and the slave trade. He finally resigned in 1880 when he returned to Europe in 1880.

Holland and Sons rose from their origins in the early 19th century to become, by the middle years of the 19th century, a rival to Gillow and one of the greatest English cabinet makers. The firm was first established as Taprell and Holland in 1803 by its two founders, Stephen Taprell and William Holland. Following a brief period in which the company was known as Taprell, Holland & Son c.1835-43, William Holland gained sole command after the senior partner Taprell's retirement. Thus, from 1843 onwards they were known as Holland and Sons, and were quick to obtain various exclusive commissions from important clients. Indeed by 1851, when the company was based in Mount Street and employed 351 people, Queen Victoria had already commissioned the execution of numerous exceptional pieces of furniture for the Royal households of Balmoral, Sandringham, Windsor and Osborne House.

During the latter half of the 19th century, Holland and Sons also supplied furniture for such notable London clubs as the Athenaeum, the Reform club and the Oxford and Cambridge club. On top of furnishing a number of government buildings, the firm also supplied pieces for various British and European exhibitions, including the famous Great Exhibition of 1851. And along with Gillows they shared the commission for the new Houses of Parliament.

Isidore Jules Bonheur regularly exhibited at the Paris Salons. Influenced by his sister Rosa he specialised in animalier sculptures with a special emphasis on horse bronzes. His equestrian models were very popular and particularly amongst the British aristocracy. James Winter was an important furniture dealer, broker and licensed appraiser based in Soho, London between 1823 and 1840. However the company that he founded is recorded as having traded in second hand furniture until its demise in 1870, probably long after Winter's death. In the course of its history, the business was renamed 'James Winter & Sons' and even re-located a couple of times, albeit always remaining on Wardour Street, *Dictionary of English Furniture Makers, 1660-1840*, ed. by G. Beard and C. Gilbert, pp 992-3.

One of the only two documented stamps, which reads: 'James Winter & Sons, 101 Wardour St., Soho, London', features on a large proportion of pieces retailed by the Winter firm and also appears impressed twice upon the present lot. The offered partners' desk, as with the vast majority of furniture known to bear Winter's name, is a very fine example from the Regency or George IV period. Several Regency items sold in James Winter's name are illustrated in C. Gilbert, *Pictorial Dictionary of Marked London Furniture, 1700-1840*, pl's 1016-1026, pp 494-8.

Throughout the latter part of its existence, Winter's company retailed both antique and contemporary pieces specifically selected to appeal to their Victorian clients' eclectic tastes, *Pictorial Dictionary of Marked London Furniture*, p57.

John Howard originally established his company at 24 Lemon Street in 1820. By 1854 he was established in the heart of the West End at 22 and 36 Berners Street. The firm grew to become one of the most fashionable and successful of the 19th century, participating in many of the International Exhibitions for the remainder of the century. Howard and Sons were commissioned to provide furniture for numerous notable clients and such beautiful houses as Sudbury Hall in Derbyshire, Elton Hall, Huntingdonshire and Stokesay Court, Shropshire. Still fashionable at the close of the century, in 1893 the enterprise even provided the fittings for Mr Vanderbilt's yacht.

Henry Robert Ferguson (died 1885) was the illegitimate son of Robert Ferguson of Raith. He served as Captain in the 9th Lancers and Lt. Col in the Grenadier Guards ultimately being promoted to General. In March 1823 he married Frances Julia Davie (died 1846), niece of the last surviving Davie/Davy, Baronets of Creedy, Devon created in 1641 and subsequently adopted the name Ferguson Davie by Royal Licence. The firm of Gillows are known to have carried out an extensive commission at Eaton Hall for the Marquess of Westminster prior to 1840. This was consistent in style with the architecture of the house which was re-built to the Gothic designs of William Porden between 1804 and 1812 . It is therefore tempting to speculate that the present overtly Gothic library table may have been supplied for Eaton Hall simultaneous to the Gillows commission or during a later phase of the building's development.

The broad lancet arches, quatrefoils and blind tracery to the frieze panels featured here, relate closely to furniture designs by William Porden, for the second Earl of Grosvenor (1767-1845) at Eaton Hall which are held in the 'Cheshire Archives and Local Studies' (see 'Furniture History', *op. cit.*, pp. 160-162, figs. 7, 8 and 9). Although the majority of the furniture supplied to Eaton was dispersed in two sales in 1959 and 1992, a significant record of the furnishing at Eaton hall was made by the artist J.C. Buckler during his visits to the house between 1823 and 1825. His watercolour depictions of the interiors were later published as a series of engravings in *Views of Eaton Hall in Cheshire, the seat of the Right Honourable Earl of Grosvenor*, 1826. It is clear from Buckler's interior views that the most of the furniture is heavily inspired by both Porden's furniture designs and the architecture. A second phase of Gothic modifications arose at Eaton Hall after the dismissal of Porden in 1821 when Benjamin Gummow (1766-1844) took over as the supervising architect. This occasioned the requirement for more furniture to fill the extended interiors. A large amount of this was evidently supplied by John Davis of 20 Lower Brook Street, London, who invoiced Lord Grosvenor the substantial sum of £14,491 10s 6d for furniture. An extensive inventory of the furniture supplied by Davis to Grosvenor is preserved in the

family archives, although most entries in the account book are not detailed enough to allow identification of the furniture that has been dispersed. One exception to this is a bed sold Sotheby's 'Eaton Hall', Cheshire 1992, lot 136. It was intended for the 'Eaton Bed Room South of Chapel', the state bedroom, which was invoiced at a cost of £128 16s, (nearly five times the amount of the other seven beds that Davis made for Lord Grosvenor) and described thus: 'a very elegant & richly carved state bed with Gothic moulded ribs & rich foliage creeper carved out of the solid wood 'double gilt' in burnished & matted gold.'

Although the state is in most respects consistent with Porden's furniture designs, the stile supports in the form of buttresses are not thus paralleled. The present library table is also notable for its use of distinctive buttress supports which would appear to lend further weight to the its reputed provenance from Eaton Hall. As such, this would align the table to John Davis's furniture commission of the 1820s. Nevertheless a tantalising reference to Library tables was made in a letter from Porden (in the Grosvenor family archive) of 7 January 1811 which included the lines 'I shall send this Evening Designs for the smaller Library Tables to stand by the fire & A design for the State Bed. The first I think will conveniently accommodate four persons for reading or writing. The second will have an appropriate effect and be rich and picturesque.' Unfortunately no designs for the bed or tables survive (see 'Furniture History', *op. cit.*, pp. 170-172, fig. 19).

A George IV mahogany pedestal library table with almost identical tracery carving, which also had reputed provenance from the Library at Eaton Hall, Cheshire, was offered Christie's London 7 July 1994, lot 129.

The label to the underside of the present lot, which is inscribed in ink: 'C.S. de Rothesay', most likely refers to Lord Stuart de Rothesay, who was responsible for purchasing and extending, as well as mostly residing at, Highcliffe Castle in Dorset, from circa 1830 until his death.

Charles Stuart, the 1st Baron Stuart de Rothesay (1779-1845), served as Ambassador in Spain during the Peninsular Campaign and held an important role in the Duke of Wellington's close circle of advisors during Napoleon's famous 'Hundred days' return. Lord Stuart de Rothesay's participation in the historic battle of Waterloo led to him being selected to ensure, following the defeat of the French, the safe return to the nation of the exiled King Louis XVIII, whom he personally accompanied back to Paris. For completing this important political task, along with his distinguished loyal service, Lord Stuart de Rothesay was rewarded by being made the British Ambassador in Paris, a position he held until his retirement in 1830.

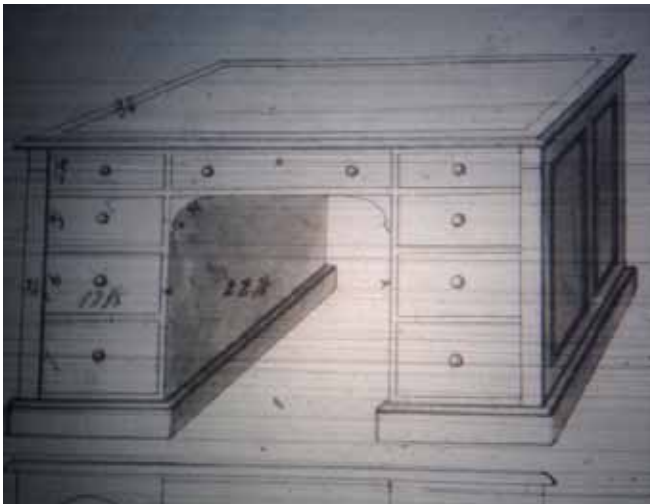

William Williamson & Sons are documented as a cabinet making firm, and also as furniture dealers, working from a couple of different addresses in Guildford between 1790 and 1840. There are numerous pieces such as the present lot which bear their stamp. However the vast majority of these, including Pembroke tables, commodes, sideboards and a secretaire bookcase, appear to be examples of their own work rather than English or Continental furniture that they merely sold on.

The current table is most likely an Italian piece in large part due to its striking, although in places somewhat stylised and naive, Neoclassical marquetry designs, as well as its overall form. This would suggest that Williamson & Sons acquired it at some point in the late 18th or early 19th century, before presumably subsequently selling it on to an interested party.

The present box is unmarked but can be attributed to Humphry Gainsborough as it is identical to another box which was made by Gainsborough and given to Christ Church United Reformed Church, Henley-on-Thames. The Henley box was lent by the Minister and Elders of the Church for an exhibition 'Gainsborough's Family' at Sudbury, Suffolk, and also features in a book "The Life and Work of Humphry Gainsborough, Enquirer & Inventor & Minister of Henley Congregational Church 1748-1776" by George H. Peters (1948). Peter's quotes the wife of the Vicar of Shiplake (*A History of Shiplake, 1893*) who states that Gainsborough "Gave one to a friend, a fire happening, it was dug up and the contents found uninjured". Peter's states that it seems reasonable to assume that the box made by Gainsborough is 'the oldest fire-resisting safe in the world'. He was not aware of the present box but it seems highly likely that Gainsborough would have made numerous examples once his box had been tested and proved to be fire-resistant.

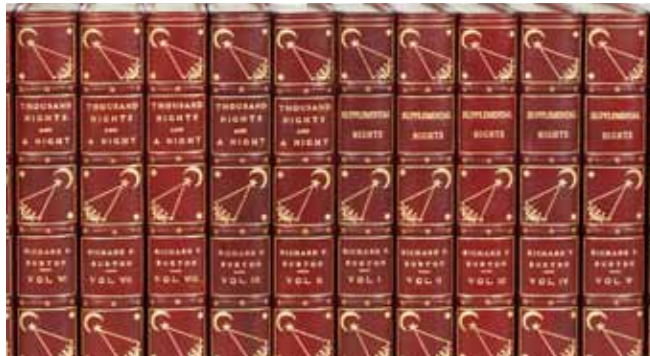

Provenance

The present chairs were executed in the Puginesque Gothic revival style reputedly either following a commission by, or alternatively for, John Hardman, whose latinized initials: 'I.H.' are carved upon the present lot.

John Hardman (1767-1844), born near Birmingham, founded and ran his own company which produced metalwork designs and manufactured objects in various metals. Later, after John's death in 1844, his son (also called John) took charge of the firm and from 1845 onwards, at the behest of his colleague Augustus Welby Northmore Pugin (1812-52), the business also began producing stained glass for numerous churches.

Pugin met the younger Hardman (1812-67) during the 1830s at the time of their joint involvement in the design and construction of St. Chad's Chapel and subsequently St. Chad's Cathedral, the latter of which was the first Roman Catholic example to be erected in England since the mid 16th century. In fact, Pugin, a Catholic convert himself, requested the Hardman & Co. firm to supply all the metalwork for St. Chad's Cathedral following many of Pugin's own designs.

But probably the most important commission that the Hardmans received was for the manufacture of all the stained glass for the Houses of Parliament, once again in conjunction with Pugin as the main interior designer, excluding the windows for the House of Lords which were provided by a rival Scottish company.

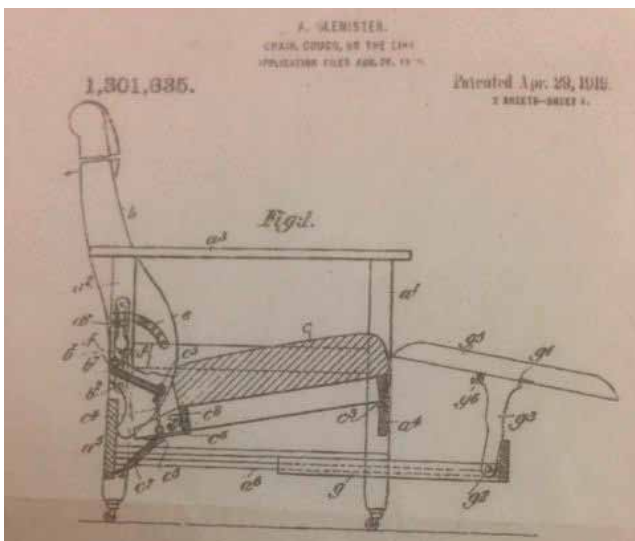

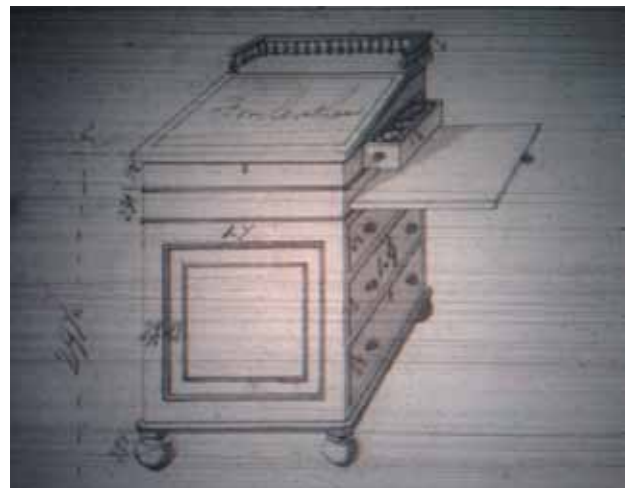

Metal was originally used in the making of chairs in Paris by the company, Gandillot & Cie, from circa 1828 onwards. Provenance

Dunford House, built by Richard Cobden in 1852.

Richard Cobden founded the Anti-Corn Law League in 1838 with John Bright, its aim being the abolishment of the unpopular Corn Laws, which protected landowners' interests by levying taxes on imported wheat, thus raising the price of bread at a time when the poorest could least afford it. The corn laws were finally abolished in 1848 and Cobden was seen by many as a heroic figure campaigning for free trade and workers welfare.

Cobden was born on the site of the present Dunford House in a farmhouse of that name in 1804. Throughout his life he travelled extensively and lived in both Manchester and London, but in 1852 he repurchased the property where he was born and erected the present Dunford House. The present house incorporates elements of the original farmhouse which Cobden preserved, and he lived there until his death in 1866. The house then passed to Cobdens' daughter, Jane Cobden-Urwin who was a Liberal politician and early proponent of women's rights. In the 1920s she largely retired from public life, and in 1928 presented Dunford House to the Cobden Memorial Association to form an institution to promote the values and causes Cobden espoused of free trade, peace and education. This spirit continued when the National Council of YMCAs accepted the endowment of Dunford House for general educational purposes in 1952. It became a centre for critical thinking focusing on the relationship between industry, training and international issues. The property has now evolved into a training and conference centre for a variety of organisations including the voluntary sector and local authorities, as well as remaining the national training centre for the YMCA.

It seems particularly apt that the present lot depicts Demosthenes who was a famous Greek orator of ancient Athens as Richard Cobden was himself a liberal thinker and radical politician. It thus seems likely that Cobden purchased the figure as he surely would have admired the theme and characteristics the piece embodied, or alternatively perhaps it was presented to him for the same reason. The marble pre-dates Dunford House by just four years and it may be that Cobden acquired it when purchasing suitable furniture and works of art to furnish this large residence, at a time when William Theed's star was rising as he enjoyed the royal patronage of Queen Victoria and Prince Albert. It also seems unlikely that either of the two related institutions that were bequeathed the house after his death would have purchased such an expensive work of art.



818

1848 was a significant year for the sculptor William Theed, marking the turning point of his career, when he returned to London after a twenty two year period working in Rome. In Rome he had studied under Thorvaldsen and John Gibson, the two most important Neo-Classical sculptors of the day before setting up his own studio. He completed his first royal commission there in 1847 for two marble groups for Osborne House, *Narcissus at the Fountain*, and *Psyche Lamenting the Loss of Cupid*. Following this commission he became a favourite of Prince Albert and Queen Victoria and this must have been a factor in his decision to relocate back to London the year after. Here his career flourished, he showed a number of works at the Great Exhibition, and at the Manchester Art Treasures Exhibition of 1857, and received numerous further royal commissions including Prince Albert's death mask.

The present figure is very similar to the figure of Aristides that Theed carved in 1842 (Christies, London, 17 March 2011, Lot 221); which was also after the antique, the original being in the Museo Borbonico (now the Museo Nazionale) which Theed had surely seen. The Roman copy of the Greek original statue of Demosthenes which is attributed to Polyuktos is now in the Ny Carlsberg Glyptotek, and dates to 280 B.C.

The design of this marble relief is based on an ancient fresco cut from the wall of the Villa di Arianna at Stabiae (near Pompeii). Discovered in the mid 1700's, this fresco was illustrated in *Le Antichità di Ercolano* by Carlo Nolli (1710-1785); a collection of images of archeological finds from Herculaneum, first published in 1757. This book helped to inspire the Neo-Classical period by disseminating a large quantity of classical designs and themes and was in print until 1792. The engraving of 'The Cupid Seller' inspired numerous copies, most famous being a painting by Joseph Marie Vien which is now at the Musée National du Château de Fontainebleau, on permanent loan from the Louvre (inv. 8424). Vien's interpretation of the theme placed the Cupid Seller and her prospective purchasers in a contemporary salon environment which was considered very risqué at the time. The notion that wealthy ladies could buy love through purchasing a Cupid in the same manner that she might purchased silks and buttons was frowned upon.

Provenance

The present lot formerly belonged to Sir Charles Groves CBE and thence by descent has remained within the family.

Sir Charles Groves (1915-92), an English conductor perhaps most celebrated for the astonishing variety of his repertoire, was renowned for supporting both contemporary composers and aspiring young conductors throughout his career.

Following a tenure with the Bournemouth Symphony Orchestra, Groves served as Musical Director of the newly formed Welsh National Opera between 1961 and 1963. However he was probably most successful and impactful in his role as Musical Director of the Royal Liverpool Philharmonic Orchestra in the period 1963-77. During this time the Philharmonic Orchestra played a wonderfully eclectic range of music, which in Groves's own words, included: 'everything from the St John Passion to Stockhausen'.

Among the numerous honours that were bestowed upon Sir Charles Groves were the Order of the British Empire in 1958, Commander of the British Empire in 1968 and a knighthood in 1973.

King Edward VII. Following the war, the workshops came to be known as H.M. Queen Mary's 'Carving School' and was primarily established for use by ex-servicemen. Often the pieces and objects produced in these workshops were sold at department stores in London and the finest examples were also displayed at the Ideal Home Exhibitions.

Flixton Hall was built in 1615 by John Tassburgh. In 1753, the Estate passed to the Wyborne family, who sold it to William Adair. He died in 1783 and the Estate passed to his son Alexander Adair (d.1834). He was succeeded by William Adair (1754-1844), who married Camilla Shafto, heiress of Benwell Tower. As he was 80 when inheriting the Hall, he made over the property to eldest son, Sir Robert Shafto Alexander Adair (1786-1869), who was created first Baronet in 1838. A fire caused major damage to Flixton Hall in December 1846 and repairs took some years. After his death in 1869, he was succeeded by his son Sir Robert Shafto Alexander Adair, 2nd Baronet. Queen Victoria subsequently created him Baron Waveney. He was in turn succeeded by his brother Sir Hugh Edward Adair, 3rd Baronet (1815-1902). He had Flixton Hall reconstructed and a new wing added (1888-92), making it a mansion of 60 rooms and 365 windows. Edward was followed by his eldest son, Sir Frederick Edward Shafto Adair, 4th Baronet (d. 1915).

In 1915 Sir Robert Shafto Adair, 5th Baronet (1862-1949) inherited the estate from his brother. Robert was a barrister, a patron of the arts and a director of the Royal Academy of Music. He married Mary Bosanquet in 1890. In 1948, the whole Flixton Estate of 2,970 acres was offered for sale. The family retained ownership of Flixton Hall and Flixton Park. After his death Robert was succeeded by his only son, Major-General Sir Allan Adair, CB, DSO, MC, JP, DL, 6th Baronet. General Adair was forced to sell the estate owing to heavy death duties levied on his father's Estate. In 1950 the fine contents of Flixton Hall were offered for sale. Flixton Hall was sold privately to a speculator and was demolished in June 1952.

The present lot is numbered 1309 suggesting that it was made by Vuillamy circa 1835-6, possibly either for William Adair or his son Robert Shafto Adair who was created a Baronet by his father in 1838 and who is also recorded as purchasing a rosewood balance clock by Vulliamy numbered 1052.

The Gothic influenced style of the oak case has an indirect comparable with another Vuillamy timepiece made for the House of Commons numbered 982 produced in 1827-8 which similarly has a regulator movement, dead beat escapement, wood rod pendulum and large rated bob.

The style of present lot is typical of furniture and other furnishing items produced in the early 19th century incorporating Gothic motifs for their decorative and romantic qualities and it is possibly that the case of the clock was produced independently by the estate carpenters but in conjunction with Vuillamy when the clock was ordered to complete the scheme for the panelled hall at the time when William or Robert were undertaking the redecoration of the Hall. The clock can be seen to the left hand side of a photograph dating perhaps from the inter-war period showing the hall seen through a two arches with a similarly styled oak refectory table to the centre which is listed as lot 664 in the 1950 catalogue.

A copy of a newspaper photograph clipping from the 1950's showing the then owner Archibald C. Brown winding the clock stating that he purchased it from the 1950 contents sale. In addition it also mentioned that Brown was actually responsible for winding the clock and other clocks at Flixton Hall from circa 1910 up until the time when the estate and contents were sold. In addition there is also a series of letters dating from the early to mid 1950s between the then owner Archibald C. Brown who and the collector S. Benson Beevers discussing blue print drawings by Vuillamy belong to Mr Brown for the Clerk of Works responsible for the erection 'so as to ease matters when he had to fix the clock after the erection of the tower'. These drawings were apparently later sold to Beevers

Following into his father Louis Durand's trade, Posper-Guillaume was a cabinet maker based in Paris where he is recorded as having worked throughout the period c.1834-1860. During the reign of King Louis Philippe, Posper-Guillaume, assisted by his father, provided a wide variety of pieces for palaces in Paris such as the Trianon and Saint-Cloud. In 1839 he was granted the title *Ebeniste du Roi* and from then on was commissioned to supply furniture for most of the Royal palaces.

The stamp or *marque au fer*: 'Durand', which is frequently followed by 'A Paris', appears impressed upon the majority of Durand's works and is clearly visible to the top corner edges of the present lot. Some of P.G. Durand's most elegant and fashionable output was displayed at several exhibitions and ultimately at the historic Paris Exhibition of 1855, C. Payne, *European Furniture of the 19th Century*, 2013, p. 38.

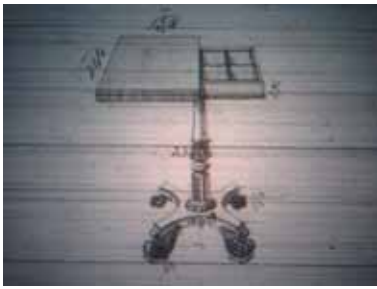

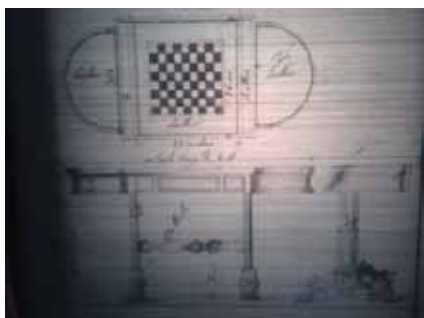

Originally of Stuart origins Wolseley Hall acquired Georgian additions including Gothick interiors by Wyatt. The staircase is thought to have been the work of Grinling Gibbons. Although it was featured in a Country Life article in 1910, by 1918 much of its furniture and other effects were scheduled to be removed from Wolseley Hall to Sunridge near Guildford, the home of Sir Charles M. Wolseley. (D(W)1781/18/7 Staffordshire and Stoke-on-Trent Archive Service, Staffordshire Record Office). The house suffered a serious fire in the 1950's and was consequently pulled down in 1966.

Thomas Willson is listed at 68 Great Queen Street, London as a furniture broker, auctioneer and appraiser (1799-1854). It has been suggested that the Willson's were good quality second-hand furniture dealers (brokers), although there is mention of a 'Furniture Works' in the 1838-54 entries, which may be a reference to a repair workshop rather than a manufactory. See G.Beard & C.Gilbert, *Dictionary of English Furniture Makers 1660-1840*, p.985.

With close similarities to a set of twenty four dining chairs made for Lord Bolton of Hackwood Park in 1813 (see S.Stuart, *Gillows of Lancaster and London 1730-1840*, 2008, p.219, pl.200 and sold Christie's sale of the contents of Hackwood Park, 20-22 April 1998, lot 158.

See also Sotheby's, London 18 November 2008, lot 397 for a similar set of chairs, in the manner of Gillows, stamped James Winter, another furniture retailer/broker.

The following three collectors' cabinets were previously removed from the Natural History Museum, following the opening of the ground breaking Darwin centre and the consequent introduction of state of the art pest-proof and climate-controlled metal cabinets to this renowned institution.

Both lots 904 and 905 formed part of the Rothschild, Cockayne and Kettlewell collection that was created in 1947. The collection, which comprised approximately 5,000 drawers of butterflies and larger moths, was transferred in 1969 from Lionel Walter Rothschild's museum in Tring to the Natural History Museum.

Dr Henry Bernard David Kettlewell (1907-79) was a physician and amateur entomologist who emigrated to South Africa to pursue research and was eventually granted a senior research fellowship at Oxford. The lifelong enthusiasm for lepidoptery of Dr Edward Alfred Cockayne (1880-1956), also a medical practitioner by profession, led him to name numerous varieties of British lepidoptera along with publishing hundreds of papers on the subject.

The present marble figure was presented to Major-General Sir James Edward Alexander to commemorate his role in the Crimean War when he commanded the 14th Regiment of Foot as lieutenant colonel in the Siege of Sevastopol in 1855.

Sir James Alexander served in the trenches at the siege, including the assault on the 18th June, was also present at the battle of the Tehernaya, and commanded the 14th Regiment at the fall of the city and received the standard medals and the 5th Class of the Turkish Order of Medjidie.

Although inscribed 1855 which was the date of the Siege of Sevastopol, it is perhaps more than a coincidence that she depicts Cleopatra, and as such was more likely to have been presented to the Major-General after his involvement with Cleopatra's Needle in 1877.

Major-General Sir James Edward Alexander was responsible for the preservation and transportation of Cleopatra's Needle from Alexandria to London. The obelisk was presented to the United Kingdom in 1819 by the ruler of Egypt and Sudan Muhammad Ali, in commemoration of the victories of Lord Nelson at the Battle of the Nile and Sir Ralph Abercromby at the Battle of Alexandria in 1801. Although the government accepted the obelisk gratefully, the cost of transporting it to London was prohibitive, and it stayed in Alexandria for another seventy six years until Major-General Alexander campaigned to have it transported to London.

The story of the removal from Alexandria is a dramatic one, involving impressive feats of engineering, shipwreck and loss of life. The needle had been buried in the sand for nearly 2000 years when it was dug out and placed in a great iron cylindrical vessel known as 'The Cleopatra' which was fitted with a stern, rudder, keels and mast, to be towed to England by the ship Olga. However in October 1877 a great storm in the Bay of Biscay hit the ship, and the cigar shaped vessel containing the needle was in grave danger. The Olga sent a boat with six volunteers to rescue the crewmen that were aboard the vessel but this boat capsized and all of the crew were lost. The Captain of the Olga eventually managed to get his ship next to the vessel and rescue the crew, but left the vessel containing the needle 'abandoned and sinking'. Fortunately the vessel did not sink and was salvaged four days later by Spanish trawler boats. She was then rescued by the Glasgow steamer Fitzmaurice and taken to Spain for repairs. However the Master of the Fitzmaurice would not relinquish the needle until he had been compensated, and lodged a salvage claim for £5000. After much negotiation this claim was eventually settled for £2000 and the needle continued her journey in her vessel, pulled by the tug boat, Anglia. By the time she eventually reached Gravesend her story had captivated the nation, and her long awaited arrival was welcomed by the cheers of school children who were given the day off to witness the event.

In 1912 the present lot formed part of the furnishings of Park House, Sandringham, which at that time belonged to H.M. King George V.

Reputedly the above daybed was purchased at auction during the 1970s, shortly before Park House was granted to the Leonard Cheshire Disability Charity by H.M. Queen Elizabeth II in 1983.

Park House, on the Sandringham Estate, is situated to the west of the Royal house and is renowned for being the place where Diana, the former Princess of Wales, was born in 1961. However, originally Park House was built in 1863 following the instructions of the Prince of Wales (later H.M. King Edward VII), only a year after the Prince had

bought Sandringham. Park House was constructed, alongside other properties such as York Cottage, to be used as living quarters for members of the household staff of Sandringham, as well as temporary accommodation for any overflow of Royal guests.

Notable among the various historical residents of Park House was the important enobled family of General Sir William Knollys, who was Treasurer and Comptroller to the Prince of Wales during the period 1866-77. The 1st Viscount Knollys, who was Sir William's son, later became Private Secretary to Edward VII, and subsequently to George V.

During the 1930s, Park House was leased to Edmund Roche, 4th Baron Fermoy, a friendly acquaintance of George V, whose wife was to become a personal advisor to The Queen Mother. A generation later, Frances, who was one of the Roches' three children, married John Spencer, Viscount Althorp, in 1954. The Spencer family continued their residence at Park House until 1975, whereupon the family moved to Althorp on the occasion of John becoming Earl Spencer.

The offered lot was produced by the renowned cabinet making firm, Holland & Sons, and was apparently executed by one of their craftsmen called E. Pitt, whose name is also stamped upon this daybed. Please refer to the footnote to lot 592 for information regarding Holland & Sons.

The design of the present lot closely follows that of a folding armchair by James Herbert McNair (1868-1955). McNair, who was a member of what later came to be known as the Glasgow school or 'The Four', was born in Glasgow into a military family. Later on he met fellow Glaswegian and future member of 'The Four', Charles Rennie Mackintosh, while they were both training as architects at Honeyman and Keppie from 1888 to 1895.

The style of the Glasgow School fused aesthetic and practical elements from various contemporaneous art movements such as Symbolism, Art Nouveau and Arts and Crafts. Although perhaps most renowned for his furniture designs, Herbert McNair also rapidly gained celebrity as a watercolourist and book illustrator, actually going on to exhibit works together with his wife, Frances MacDonald, at numerous exhibitions in London and across Europe during the very first years of the 20th century.

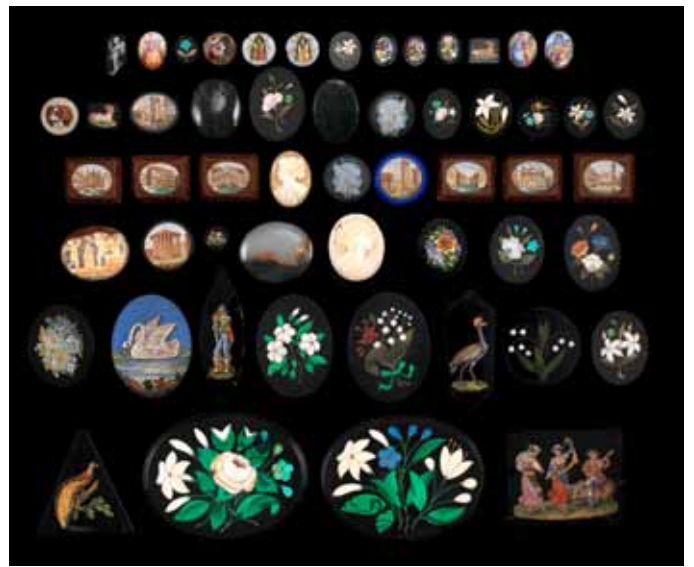

During the 18th and 19th centuries the interest in classical sculpture was at its height and many original examples and copies adorned country houses and art academies all over Britain. The famous Parthenon frieze formed part of Lord Elgin's collection of Greek sculpture that was first displayed in England at Elgin's London home on the corner of Park Lane and Piccadilly from 1808 to invited guests.

John Henning, a Scottish born artist, was one of the first to access the collection and like most who saw it was struck by the beauty of the pieces. He embarked on a project of making models of the Parthenon and Phigaleian friezes, restoring the missing elements, an undertaking which he felt was not only useful for his own artistic gain, but also for pecuniary reasons. His initial studies in ivory were unsuccessful and so he intaglio carved slate which he used as moulds for plaster casting, producing small tablet sections which were sold in boxes. Working for Josiah Wedgwood at the time, Henning took twelve years to complete the reliefs.

This notice is addressed by *Bonhams* to any person who may be interested in a *Lot*, including *Bidders* and potential *Bidders* (including any eventual *Buyer* of the *Lot*). For ease of reference we refer to such persons as "*Bidders*" or "you". Our List of Definitions and Glossary is incorporated into this *Notice to Bidders*. It is at Appendix 3 at the back of the *Catalogue*. Where words and phrases are used in this notice which are in the List of Definitions, they are printed in italics.

IMPORTANT: Additional information applicable to the *Sale* may be set out in the *Catalogue* for the *Sale*, in an insert in the *Catalogue* and/or in a notice displayed at the *Sale* venue and you should read them as well. Announcements affecting the *Sale* may also be given out orally before and during the *Sale* without prior written notice. You should be alert to the possibility of changes and ask in advance of bidding if there have been any.

1. OUR ROLE

In its role as *Auctioneer* of *Lots*, *Bonhams* acts solely for and in the interests of the *Seller*. *Bonhams'* job is to sell the *Lot* at the highest price obtainable at the *Sale* to a *Bidder*. *Bonhams* does not act for *Buyers* or *Bidders* in this role and does not give advice to *Buyers* or *Bidders*. When it or its staff make statements about a *Lot* or, if *Bonhams* provides a *Condition Report* on a *Lot* it is doing that on behalf of the *Seller* of the *Lot*. *Bidders* and *Buyers* who are themselves not expert in the *Lots* are strongly advised to seek and obtain independent advice on the *Lots* and their value before bidding for them. The *Seller* has authorised *Bonhams* to sell the *Lot* as its agent on its behalf and, save where we expressly make it clear to the contrary, *Bonhams* acts only as agent for the *Seller*. Any statement or representation we make in respect of a *Lot* is made on the *Seller's* behalf and, unless *Bonhams* sells a *Lot* as principal, not on our behalf and any *Contract for Sale* is between the *Buyer* and the *Seller* and not with us. If *Bonhams* sells a *Lot* as principal this will either be stated in the *Catalogue* or an announcement to that effect will be made by the *Auctioneer*, or it will be stated in a notice at the *Sale* or an insert in the *Catalogue*.

Bonhams does not owe or undertake or agree to any duty or responsibility to you in contract or tort (whether direct, collateral, express, implied or otherwise). If you successfully bid for a *Lot* and buy it, at that stage *Bonhams* does enter into an agreement with the *Buyer*. The terms of that contract are set out in our *Buyer's Agreement*, which you will find at Appendix 2 at the back of the *Catalogue*. This will govern *Bonhams'* relationship with the *Buyer*.

2. LOTS

Subject to the *Contractual Description* printed in bold letters in the *Entry* about the *Lot* in the *Catalogue* (see paragraph 3 below), *Lots* are sold to the *Buyer* on an "as is" basis, with all faults and imperfections. Illustrations and photographs contained in the *Catalogue* (other than photographs forming part of the *Contractual Description*) or elsewhere of any *Lots* are for identification purposes only. They may not reveal the true condition of the *Lot*. A photograph or illustration may not reflect an accurate reproduction of the colour(s) of the *Lot*. *Lots* are available for inspection prior to the *Sale* and it is for you to satisfy yourself as to each and every aspect of a *Lot*, including its authorship, attribution, condition, provenance, history, background, authenticity, style, period, age, suitability, quality, roadworthiness (if relevant), origin, value and estimated selling price (including the *Hammer Price*). It is your responsibility to examine any *Lot* in which you are interested. It should be remembered that the actual condition of a *Lot* may not be as good as that indicated by its outward appearance. In particular, parts may have been replaced or renewed and *Lots* may not be authentic or of satisfactory quality; the inside of a *Lot* may not be visible and may not be original or may be damaged, as for example where it is covered by upholstery or material. Given the age of many *Lots* they may have been damaged and/or repaired and you should not assume that a *Lot* is in good condition. Electronic or mechanical parts may not operate or may not comply with current statutory requirements. You should not assume that electrical items designed to operate on mains electricity will be suitable for connection to the mains electricity supply and you should obtain a report from

a qualified electrician on their status before doing so. Such items which are unsuitable for connection are sold as items of interest for display purposes only. If you yourself do not have expertise regarding a *Lot*, you should consult someone who does to advise you. We can assist in arranging facilities for you to carry out or have carried out more detailed inspections and tests. Please ask our staff for details.

Any person who damages a *Lot* will be held liable for the loss caused.

3. DESCRIPTIONS OF LOTS AND ESTIMATES

Contractual Description of a Lot

The *Catalogue* contains an *Entry* about each *Lot*. Each *Lot* is sold by its respective *Seller* to the *Buyer* of the *Lot* as corresponding only with that part of the *Entry* which is printed in bold letters and (except for the colour, which may be inaccurately reproduced) with any photograph of the *Lot* in the *Catalogue*. The remainder of the *Entry*, which is not printed in bold letters, represents *Bonhams'* opinion (given on behalf of the *Seller*) about the *Lot* only and is not part of the *Contractual Description* in accordance with which the *Lot* is sold by the *Seller*.

Estimates

In most cases, an *Estimate* is printed beside the *Entry*. *Estimates* are only an expression of *Bonhams'* opinion made on behalf of the *Seller* of the range where *Bonhams* thinks the *Hammer Price* for the *Lot* is likely to fall; it is not an *Estimate* of value. It does not take into account any *VAT* or *Buyer's Premium* payable. *Lots* can in fact sell for *Hammer Prices* below and above the *Estimate*. Any *Estimate* should not be relied on as an indication of the actual selling price or value of a *Lot*. *Estimates* are in the currency of the *Sale*.

Condition Reports

In respect of most *Lots*, you may ask for a *Condition Report* on its physical condition from *Bonhams*. If you do so, this will be provided by *Bonhams* on behalf of the *Seller* free of charge. *Bonhams* is not entering into a contract with you in respect of the *Condition Report* and accordingly does not assume responsibility to you in respect of it. Nor does the *Seller* owe or agree to owe you as a *Bidder* any obligation or duty in respect of this free report about a *Lot*, which is available for your own inspection or for inspection by an expert instructed by you. However, any written *Description* of the physical condition of the *Lot* contained in a *Condition Report* will form part of the *Contractual Description* of the *Lot* under which it is sold to any *Buyer*.

The Seller's responsibility to you

The *Seller* does not make or agree to make any representation of fact or contractual promise, *Guarantee* or warranty and undertakes no obligation or duty, whether in contract or in tort (other than to the eventual *Buyer* as set out above), in respect of the accuracy or completeness of any statement or representation made by him or on his behalf, which is in any way descriptive of any *Lot* or as to the anticipated or likely selling price of any *Lot*. Other than as set out above, no statement or representation in any way descriptive of a *Lot* or any *Estimate* is incorporated into any *Contract for Sale* between a *Seller* and a *Buyer*.

Bonhams' responsibility to you

You have the opportunity of examining the *Lot* if you want to and the *Contract for Sale* for a *Lot* is with the *Seller* and not with *Bonhams*; *Bonhams* acts as the *Seller's* agent only (unless *Bonhams* sells the *Lot* as principal).

Bonhams undertakes no obligation to you to examine, investigate or carry out any tests, either in sufficient depth or at all, on each *Lot* to establish the accuracy or otherwise of any *Descriptions* or opinions given by *Bonhams*, or by any person on *Bonhams'* behalf, whether in the *Catalogue* or elsewhere.

You should not suppose that such examinations, investigations or tests have occurred.

Bonhams does not make or agree to make any representation of fact, and undertakes no obligation or duty (whether in contract or tort) in respect of the accuracy or completeness of any statement or representation made by *Bonhams* or on

Bonhams' behalf which is in any way descriptive of any *Lot* or as to the anticipated or likely selling price of any *Lot*. No statement or representation by *Bonhams* or on its behalf in any way descriptive of any *Lot* or any *Estimate* is incorporated into our *Buyer's Agreement*.

Alterations

Descriptions and *Estimates* may be amended at *Bonhams'* discretion from time to time by notice given orally or in writing before or during a *Sale*.

THE *LOT* IS AVAILABLE FOR INSPECTION AND YOU MUST FORM YOUR OWN OPINION IN RELATION TO IT. YOU ARE STRONGLY ADVISED TO EXAMINE ANY *LOT* OR HAVE IT EXAMINED ON YOUR BEHALF BEFORE THE *SALE*.

4. CONDUCT OF THE SALE

Our *Sales* are public auctions which persons may attend and you should take the opportunity to do so. We do reserve the right at our sole discretion to refuse admission to our premises or to any *Sale* without stating a reason. We have complete discretion as to whether the *Sale* proceeds, whether any *Lot* is included in the *Sale*, the manner in which the *Sale* is conducted and we may offer *Lots* for *Sale* in any order we choose notwithstanding the numbers given to *Lots* in the *Catalogue*. You should therefore check the date and starting time of the *Sale*, whether there have been any withdrawals or late entries. Remember that withdrawals and late entries may affect the time at which a *Lot* you are interested in is put up for *Sale*. We have complete discretion to refuse any bid, to nominate any bidding increment we consider appropriate, to divide any *Lot*, to combine two or more *Lots*, to withdraw any *Lot* from a *Sale* and, before the *Sale* has been closed, to put up any *Lot* for auction again. Auction speeds can exceed 100 *Lots* to the hour and bidding increments are generally about 10%. However these do vary from *Sale* to *Sale* and from *Auctioneer* to *Auctioneer*. Please check with the department organising the *Sale* for advice on this. Where a *Reserve* has been applied to a *Lot*, the *Auctioneer* may, in his absolute discretion, place bids (up to an amount not equaling or exceeding such *Reserve*) on behalf of the *Seller*. We are not responsible to you in respect of the presence or absence of any *Reserve* in respect of any *Lot*. The *Buyer* will be the *Bidder* who makes the highest bid acceptable to the *Auctioneer* for any *Lot* (subject to any applicable *Reserve*) to whom the *Lot* is knocked down by the *Auctioneer* at the fall of the *Auctioneer's* hammer. 5. BIDDING

We do not accept bids from any person who has not completed and delivered to us one of our *Bidding Forms*, either our *Bidder Registration Form*, *Absentee Bidding Form* or *Telephone Bidding Form*. You will be asked for proof of identity, residence and references, which, when asked for, you must supply if your bids are to be accepted by us. Please bring your passport, driving licence (or similar photographic proof of identity) and proof of address. We may request a deposit from you before allowing you to bid. We may refuse entry to a *Sale* to any person even if that person has completed a *Bidding Form*.

Bidding in person

You should come to our *Bidder* registration desk at the *Sale* venue and fill out a *Bidder* Registration Form on (or, if possible, before) the day of the *Sale*. The bidding number system is sometimes referred to as "paddle bidding". You will be issued with a large card (a "paddle") with a printed number on it. This will be attributed to you for the purposes of the *Sale*. Should you be a successful *Bidder* you will need to ensure that your number can be clearly seen by the *Auctioneer* and that it is your number which is identified as the *Buyer's*. You should not let anyone else use your paddle as all *Lots* will be invoiced to the name and address given on your *Bidder* Registration Form. Once an invoice is issued it will not be changed. If there is any doubt as to the *Hammer Price* of, or whether you are the successful *Bidder* of, a particular *Lot*, you must draw this to the attention of the *Auctioneer* before the next *Lot* is offered for *Sale*. Telephone calls will be recorded. The telephone bidding facility is a discretionary service and may not be available in relation to all *Lots*. We will not be responsible for bidding on your behalf if you are unavailable at the time of the *Sale* or if the telephone connection is interrupted during bidding. Please contact us for further details.

Bidding by post or fax

Absentee *Bidding Forms* can be found in the back of this *Catalogue* and should be completed and sent to the office responsible for the *Sale*. It is in your interests to return your form as soon as possible, as if two or more *Bidders* submit identical bids for a *Lot*, the first bid received takes preference. In any event, all bids should be received at least 24 hours before the start of the *Sale*. Please check your Absentee *Bidding Form* carefully before returning it to us, fully completed and signed by you. It is your responsibility to check with our Bids Office that your bid has been received. This additional service is complimentary and is confidential. Such bids are made at your own risk and we cannot accept liability for our failure to receive and/or place any such bids. All bids made on your behalf will be made at the lowest level possible subject to *Reserves* and other bids made for the *Lot*. Where appropriate your bids will be rounded down to the nearest amount consistent with the *Auctioneer's* bidding increments. New *Bidders* must also provide proof of identity and address when submitting bids. Failure to do this will result in your bid not being placed.

Bidding via the internet

Bidding through an agent

Bids will be accepted as placed on behalf of the person named as the principal on the *Bidding Form* although we may refuse to accept bids from an agent on behalf of a principal and will require written confirmation from the principal confirming the agent's authority to bid. Nevertheless, as the *Bidding Form* explains, any person placing a bid as agent on behalf of another (whether or not he has disclosed that fact or the identity of his principal) will be jointly and severally liable with the principal to the *Seller* and to *Bonhams* under any contract resulting from the acceptance of a bid. Subject to the above, please let us know if you are acting on behalf of another person when bidding for *Lots* at the *Sale*.

Equally, please let us know if you intend to nominate another person to bid on your behalf at the *Sale* unless this is to be carried out by us pursuant to a Telephone or Absentee *Bidding Form* that you have completed. If we do not approve the agency arrangements in writing before the *Sale*, we are entitled to assume that the person bidding at the *Sale* is bidding on his own behalf. Accordingly, the person bidding at the *Sale* will be the *Buyer* and will be liable to pay the *Hammer Price* and *Buyer's Premium* and associated charges. If we approve the identity of your client in advance, we will be in a position to

address the invoice to your principal rather than you. We will require proof of the agent's client's identity and residence in advance of any bids made by the agent on his behalf. Please refer to our *Conditions of Business* and contact our Customer Services Department for further details.

6. CONTRACTS BETWEEN THE BUYER AND SELLER AND THE BUYER AND BONHAMS

On the *Lot* being knocked down to the *Buyer*, a *Contract for Sale* of the *Lot* will be entered into between the *Seller* and the *Buyer* on the terms of the *Contract for Sale* set out in Appendix 1 at the back of the *Catalogue*. You will be liable to pay the *Purchase Price*, which is the *Hammer Price* plus any applicable VAT. At the same time, a separate contract is also entered into between us as *Auctioneers* and the *Buyer*. This is our *Buyer's Agreement*, the terms of which are set out in Appendix 2 at the back of the *Catalogue*. Please read the terms of the *Contract for Sale* and our *Buyer's Agreement* contained in the *Catalogue* in case you are the successful *Bidder*. We may change the terms of either or both of these agreements in advance of their being entered into, by setting out different terms in the *Catalogue* and/or by placing an insert in the *Catalogue* and/or by notices at the *Sale* venue and/or by oral announcements before and during the *Sale*. You should be alert to this possibility of changes and ask if there have been any.

7. BUYER'S PREMIUM AND OTHER CHARGES PAYABLE BY THE BUYER

Under the *Buyer's Agreement*, a premium (the *Buyer's Premium*) is payable to us by the *Buyer* in accordance with the terms of the *Buyer's Agreement* and at rates set out below, calculated by reference to the *Hammer Price* and payable in addition to it. Storage charges and *Expenses* are also payable by the *Buyer* as set out in the *Buyer's Agreement*. All the sums payable to us by the *Buyer* are subject to VAT. For this *Sale* the following rates of *Buyer's Premium* will be payable by *Buyers* of *Lots*:

25% up to £50,000 of the *Hammer Price*
20% from £50,001 to £1,000,000 of the *Hammer Price*
12% from £1,000,001 of the *Hammer Price*

On certain *Lots*, which will be marked "AR" in the *Catalogue* and which are sold for a *Hammer Price* of £1,000 or greater (converted into the currency of the *Sale* using the European Central Bank Reference rate prevailing on the date of the *Sale*), the *Additional Premium* will be payable to us by the *Buyer* to cover our *Expenses* relating to the payment of royalties under the Artists Resale Right Regulations 2006. The *Additional Premium* will be a percentage of the amount of the *Hammer Price* calculated in accordance with the table below, and shall not exceed €12,500 (converted into the currency of the *Sale* using the European Central Bank Reference rate prevailing on the date of the *Sale*).

8. VAT

The prevailing rate of VAT at the time of going to press is 20%, but this is subject to government change and the rate payable will be the rate in force on the date of the *Sale*.

The following symbols are used to denote that VAT is due on the *Hammer Price* and *Buyer's Premium*:

- † VAT at the prevailing rate on *Hammer Price* and *Buyer's Premium*
- Ω VAT on imported items at the prevailing rate on *Hammer Price* and *Buyer's Premium*
- * VAT on imported items at a preferential rate of 5% on *Hammer Price* and the prevailing rate on *Buyer's Premium*

- G Gold bullion exempt from VAT on the *Hammer Price* and subject to VAT at the prevailing rate on the *Buyer's Premium*
- Zero rated for VAT, no VAT will be added to the *Hammer Price* or the *Buyer's Premium*
- α *Buyers* from within the EU: VAT is payable at the prevailing rate on just the *Buyer's Premium* (NOT the *Hammer Price*). *Buyers* from outside the EU: VAT is payable at the prevailing rate on both *Hammer Price* and *Buyer's Premium*. If a *Buyer*, having registered under a non-EU address, decides that the item is not to be exported from the EU, then he should advise *Bonhams* immediately.

In all other instances no VAT will be charged on the *Hammer Price*, but VAT at the prevailing rate will be added to *Buyer's Premium* which will be invoiced on a VAT inclusive basis.

9. PAYMENT

It is of critical importance that you ensure that you have readily available funds to pay the *Purchase Price* and the *Buyer's Premium* (plus VAT and any other charges and *Expenses* to us) in full before making a bid for the *Lot*. If paying by bank transfer, the amount received after the deduction of any bank fees and/or conversion of the currency of payment to pounds sterling must not be less than the sterling amount payable, as set out on the invoice.

Debit cards: there is no additional charge for purchases made with personal debit cards, issued by a UK bank. Debit cards issued by an overseas bank, deferred and company debit cards and all credit cards will be subject to a 2% surcharge;

Union Pay cards: these are now accepted at our Knightsbridge and New Bond Street offices, when presented in person by the card holder. These cards are subject to a 2% surcharge.

Credit cards: Visa and Mastercard only. Please note there is a 2% surcharge on the total invoice value when payments are made using credit cards. Neither we nor the *Seller* will be liable for any loss of *Business*, profits, revenue or income, or for loss of reputation, or for disruption to *Business* or wasted time on the part of management or staff, or for indirect losses or consequential damages of any kind, irrespective in any case of the nature, volume or source of the loss or damage alleged to be suffered, and irrespective of whether the said loss or damage is caused by or claimed in respect of any negligence, other tort, breach of contract (if any) or statutory duty, restitutionary claim or otherwise. In any circumstances where we and/or the *Seller* are liable in relation to any *Lot* or

any *Description* or *Estimate* made of any *Lot*, or the conduct of any *Sale* in relation to any *Lot*, whether in damages, for an indemnity or contribution, or for a restitutionary remedy or otherwise, our and/or the *Seller's* liability (combined, if both we and the *Seller* are liable) will be limited to payment of a sum which will not exceed by way of maximum the amount of the *Purchase Price* of the *Lot* irrespective in any case of the nature, volume or source of any loss or damage alleged to be suffered or sum claimed as due, and irrespective of whether the liability arises from any negligence, other tort, breach of contract (if any) or statutory duty or otherwise. Nothing set out above will be construed as excluding or restricting (whether directly or indirectly) our liability or excluding or restricting any person's rights or remedies in respect of (i) fraud, or (ii) death or personal injury caused by our negligence (or by the negligence of any person under our control or for whom we are legally responsible), or (iii) acts or omissions for which we are liable under the Occupiers Liability Act 1957, or (iv) any other liability to the extent the same may not be excluded or restricted as a matter of law or (v) our undertakings under paragraphs 9 (in relation to specialist *Stamp* or *Book Sales* only) and 10 of the *Buyer's Agreement*. The same applies in respect of the *Seller*, as if references to us in this paragraph were substituted with references to the *Seller*.

15. BOOKS

As stated above, all *Lots* are sold on an "as is" basis, subject to all faults, imperfections and errors of *Description* save as set out below. However, you will be entitled to reject a *Book* in the circumstances set out in paragraph 11 of the *Buyers Agreement*. Please note that *Lots* comprising printed *Books*, unframed maps and bound manuscripts are not liable to VAT on the *Buyer's Premium*.

16. CLOCKS AND WATCHES

All *Lots* are sold "as is", and the absence of any reference to the condition of a clock or watch does not imply that the *Lot* is in good condition and without defects, repairs or restorations. Most clocks and watches have been repaired in the course of their normal lifetime and may now incorporate parts not original to them. Furthermore, *Bonhams* makes no representation or warranty that any clock or watch is in working order. As clocks and watches often contain fine and complex mechanisms, *Bidders* should be aware that a general service, change of battery or further repair work, for which the *Buyer* is solely responsible, may be necessary. *Bidders* should be aware that the importation of watches such as Rolex, Frank Muller and Corum into the United States is highly restricted. These watches may not be shipped to the USA and can only be imported personally.

17. FIREARMS – PROOF, CONDITION AND CERTIFICATION

Proof of Firearms

The term "proof exemption" indicates that a firearm has been examined at a Proof House, but not proved, as either (a) it was deemed of interest and not intended for use, or (b) ammunition was not available. In either case, the firearm must be regarded as unsafe to fire unless subsequently proved. Firearms proved for Black Powder should not be used with smokeless ammunition.

The term "Certificate of Unprovability" indicates that a firearm has been examined at a Proof House and is deemed both unsuitable for proof and use. Reproof is required before any such firearm is to be used.

Guns Sold as Parts

Barrels of guns sold as parts will only be made available for sleeving and measurements once rendered unserviceable according to the Gun Barrel Proof Act of 1968 to 1978 and the Rules of Proof.

Condition of Firearms

Comment in this *Catalogue* is restricted, in general, to exceptional condition and to those defects that might affect the immediate safety of a firearm in normal use. An intending *Bidder* unable to make technical examinations and assessments is recommended to seek advice from a gunmaker or from a

modern firearms specialist. All prospective *Bidders* are advised to consult the * of bore and wall-thickness measurements posted in the saleroom and available from the department. *Bidders* should note that guns are stripped only where there is a strong indication of a mechanical malfunction. Stripping is not, otherwise, undertaken. Guns intended for use should be stripped and cleaned beforehand. Hammer guns should have their rebound mechanisms checked before use. Please be advised that if a successful *Bidder* is then unable to produce the correct paperwork, the *Lot(s)* will be reoffered by *Bonhams* in the next appropriate *Sale*, on standard terms for *Sellers*, and you will be responsible for any loss incurred by *Bonhams* on the original *Sale* to you.

Lots marked 'S2' and bearing blue labels are Section 2 firearms and require a valid British Shotgun certificate, RFD licence or import licence.

Lots marked 'S5' and bearing specially marked red labels are Section 5 prohibited firearms and require a valid Section 5 Authority or import licence.

Lots marked with a 'S58' and bearing yellow labels are for obsolete calibres and no licence is required unless ammunition is held.

Unmarked *Lots* require no licence.

Gemstones

Historically many gemstones have been subjected to a variety of treatments to enhance their appearance. Sapphires and rubies are routinely heat treated to improve their colour and clarity, similarly emeralds are frequently treated with oils or resin for the same purpose. Other treatments such as staining, irradiation or coating may have been used on other gemstones. These treatments may be permanent, whilst others may need special care or re-treatment over the years to retain their appearance. *Bidders* should be aware that *Estimates* assume that gemstones may have been subjected to such treatments. A number of laboratories issue certificates that give more detailed *Descriptions* of gemstones. This information is given as a guide and *Bidders* should satisfy themselves with regard to this information as to its accuracy.

- The date given is that of the image (negative). Where no further date is given, this indicates that the photographic print is vintage (the term "vintage" may also be included in the *Lot Description*). A vintage photograph is one which was made within approximately 5-10 years of the negative. Where a second, later date appears, this refers to the date of printing. - "Manner of Jacopo Bassano": in our opinion a work in the style of the artist and of a later date;
- "After Jacopo Bassano": in our opinion, a copy of a known work of the artist;
- "Signed and/or dated and/or inscribed": in our opinion the signature and/or date and/or inscription are from the hand of the artist;
- "Bears a signature and/or date and/or inscription": in our opinion the signature and/or date and/or inscription have been added by another hand.

22. PORCELAIN AND GLASS

Damage and Restoration

For your guidance, in our *Catalogues* we detail, as far as practicable, recorded all significant defects, cracks and restoration. Such practicable *Descriptions* of damage cannot be definitive, and in providing *Condition Reports*, we cannot *Guarantee* that there are no other defects present which have not been mentioned. *Bidders* should satisfy themselves by inspection, as to the condition of each *Lot*. Please see the *Contract for Sale* printed in this *Catalogue*. Because of the difficulty in determining whether an item of glass has been repolished, in our *Catalogues* reference is only made to visible chips and cracks. No mention is made of repolishing, severe or otherwise.

Whilst the Club and Veteran Car Company Ltd make every effort to ensure accuracy, the date shown on the Dating Plate or Dating Certificate cannot be guaranteed as correct and intending purchasers should make their own enquiries as to the date of the car.

24. WINE

Lots which are lying under Bond and those liable to VAT may not be available for immediate collection.

Examining the wines

It is occasionally possible to provide a pre-*Sale* tasting for larger parcels (as defined below). This is generally limited to more recent and everyday drinking wines. Please contact the department for details.

It is not our policy to inspect every unopened case. In the case of wines older than 20 years the boxes will usually have been opened and levels and appearance noted in the *Catalogue* where necessary. You should make proper allowance for variations in ullage levels and conditions of corks, capsules and labels.

Corks and Ullages

Ullage refers to the space between the base of the cork and the wine. Ullage levels for Bordeaux shaped bottles are only normally noted when below the neck and for Burgundy, Alsace, German and Cognac shaped bottles when greater than 4 centimetres (cm). Acceptable ullage levels increase with age; generally acceptable levels are as follows:

Under 15 years old – into neck or less than 4cm
15 to 30 years old – top shoulder (ts) or up to 5cm
Over 30 years old – high shoulder (hs) or up to 6cm

It should be noted that ullages may change between publication of the *Catalogue* and the *Sale* and that corks may fail as a result of transporting the wine. We will only accept responsibility for *Descriptions* of condition at the time of publication of the *Catalogue* and cannot accept responsibility for any loss resulting from failure of corks either before or after this point.

Options to buy parcels

A parcel is a number of *Lots* of identical size of the same wine, bottle size and *Description*. The *Buyer* of any of these *Lots* has the option to accept some or all of the remaining *Lots* in the parcel at the same price, although such options will be at the *Auctioneer's* sole discretion. CONTRACT FOR SALE

IMPORTANT: These terms may be changed in advance of the *Sale* of the *Lot* to you, by the setting out of different terms in the *Catalogue* for the *Sale* and/or by placing an insert in the *Catalogue* and/or by notices at the *Sale* venue and/or by oral announcements before and during the *Sale* at the *Sale* venue. You should be alert to this possibility of changes and ask in advance of bidding if there have been any.

Under this contract the *Seller's* liability in respect of the quality of the *Lot*, its fitness for any purpose and its conformity with any *Description* is limited. You are strongly advised to examine the *Lot* for yourself and/or obtain an independent examination of it before you buy it.

1 THE CONTRACT

- 1.1 These terms govern the *Contract for Sale* of the *Lot* by the *Seller* to the *Buyer*.
- 1.2 The Definitions and Glossary contained in Appendix 3 in the *Catalogue* are incorporated into this *Contract for Sale* and a separate copy can also be provided by *Bonhams* on request. Where words and phrases are used which are in the List of Definitions, they are printed in italics.
- 1.3 The *Seller* sells the *Lot* as the principal to the *Contract for Sale*, such contract being made between the *Seller* and you through *Bonhams* which acts in the sole capacity as the *Seller's* agent and not as an additional principal. However, if the *Catalogue* states that *Bonhams* sells the *Lot* as principal, or such a statement is made by an announcement by the *Auctioneer*, or by a notice at the *Sale*, or an insert in the *Catalogue*, then *Bonhams* is the *Seller* for the purposes of this agreement.
- 1.4 The contract is made on the fall of the *Auctioneer's* hammer in respect of the *Lot* when it is knocked down to you.

2 SELLER'S UNDERTAKINGS

- 2.1 The *Seller* undertakes to you that:
- 2.1.1 the *Seller* is the owner of the *Lot* or is duly authorised to sell the *Lot* by the owner;
- 2.1.2 save as disclosed in the *Entry* for the *Lot* in the *Catalogue*, the *Seller* sells the *Lot* with full title guarantee or, where the *Seller* is an executor, trustee, liquidator, receiver or administrator, with whatever right, title or interest he may have in the *Lot*;
- 2.1.3 except where the *Sale* is by an executor, trustee, liquidator, receiver or administrator the *Seller* is both legally entitled to sell the *Lot*, and legally capable of conferring on you quiet possession of the *Lot* and that the *Sale* conforms in every respect with the terms implied by the Sale of Goods Act 1979, Sections 12(1) and 12(2) (see the Definitions and Glossary);

- 4.1 The *Seller* does not make and does not agree to make any contractual promise, undertaking, obligation, guarantee, warranty, or representation of fact in relation to the satisfactory quality of the *Lot* or its fitness for any purpose.

- 4.2 The *Seller* will not be liable for any breach of any undertaking, whether implied by the Sale of Goods Act 1979 or otherwise, as to the satisfactory quality of the *Lot* or its fitness for any purpose.

5 RISK, PROPERTY AND TITLE

- 5.1 Risk in the *Lot* passes to you when it is knocked down to you on the fall of the *Auctioneer's* hammer in respect of the *Lot*. The *Seller* will not be responsible thereafter for the *Lot* prior to you collecting it from *Bonhams* or the *Storage Contractor*, with whom you have separate contract(s) as *Buyer*. 6 PAYMENT

APPENDIX 2

BUYER'S AGREEMENT

IMPORTANT: These terms may be changed in advance of the Sale of the Lot to you, by the setting out of different terms in the Catalogue for the Sale and/or by placing an insert in the Catalogue and/or by notices at the Sale venue and/or by oral announcements before and during the Sale at the Sale venue. You should be alert to this possibility of changes and ask in advance of bidding if there have been any.

1 THE CONTRACT

- 1.1 These terms govern the contract between *Bonhams* personally and the *Buyer*, being the person to whom a Lot has been knocked down by the *Auctioneer*.
- 1.2 The Definitions and Glossary contained in Appendix 3 to the Catalogue for the Sale are incorporated into this agreement and a separate copy can also be provided by us on request. Where words and phrases which are defined in the List of Definitions are used in this agreement, they are printed in italics. Reference is made in this agreement to information printed in the *Notice to Bidders*, printed in the Catalogue for the Sale, and where such information is referred to it is incorporated into this agreement.
- 1.3 Except as specified in paragraph 4 of the *Notice to Bidders* the Contract for Sale of the Lot between you and the Seller is made on the fall of the *Auctioneer's* hammer in respect of the Lot, when it is knocked down to you. At that moment a separate contract is also made between you and *Bonhams* on the terms in this *Buyer's Agreement*.
- 1.4 We act as agents for the Seller and are not answerable or personally responsible to you for any breach of contract or other default by the Seller, unless *Bonhams* sells the Lot as principal.
- 1.5 Our personal obligations to you are governed by this agreement and we agree, subject to the terms below, to the following obligations:
 - 1.5.1 we will, until the date and time specified in the *Notice to Bidders* or otherwise notified to you, store the Lot in accordance with paragraph 5;
 - 1.5.2 subject to any power of the Seller or us to refuse to release the Lot to you, we will release the Lot to you in accordance with paragraph 4 once you have paid to us, in cleared funds, everything due to us and the Seller;
 - 1.5.3 we will provide guarantees in the terms set out in paragraphs 9 and 10.
- 1.6 We do not make or give and do not agree to make or give any contractual promise, undertaking, obligation, *Guarantee*, warranty, representation of fact in relation to any *Description* of the Lot or any *Estimate* in relation to it, nor of the accuracy or completeness of any *Description* or *Estimate* which may have been made by us or on our behalf or by or on behalf of the Seller (whether made orally or in writing, including in the Catalogue or on *Bonhams' Website*, or by conduct, or otherwise), and whether made before or after this agreement or prior to or during the Sale. No such *Description* or *Estimate* is incorporated into this agreement between you and us. Any such *Description* or *Estimate*, if made by us or on our behalf, was (unless *Bonhams* itself sells the Lot as principal) made as agent on behalf of the Seller.

2 PERFORMANCE OF THE CONTRACT FOR SALE

You undertake to us personally that you will observe and comply with all your obligations and undertakings to the Seller under the Contract for Sale in respect of the Lot.

3 PAYMENT

- 3.1 Unless agreed in writing between you and us or as otherwise set out in the *Notice to Bidders*, you must pay to us by not later than 4.30pm on the second working day following the Sale:
 - 3.1.1 the Purchase Price for the Lot;
 - 3.1.2 a Buyer's Premium in accordance with the rates set out in the *Notice to Bidders*, and
 - 3.1.3 if the Lot is marked [AR], an Additional Premium which is calculated and payable in accordance with the *Notice to Bidders* together with VAT on that sum if applicable so that all sums due to us are cleared funds by the seventh working day after the Sale.
- 3.2 You must also pay us on demand any Expenses payable pursuant to this agreement.
- 3.3 All payments to us must be made in the currency in which the Sale was conducted, using, unless otherwise agreed by us in writing, one of the methods of payment set out in the *Notice to Bidders*. Our invoices will only be addressed to the registered Bidder unless the Bidder is acting as an agent for a named principal and we have approved that arrangement, in which case we will address the invoice to the principal.
- 3.4 Unless otherwise stated in this agreement all sums payable to us will be subject to VAT at the appropriate rate and VAT will be payable by you on all such sums.
- 3.5 We may deduct and retain for our own benefit from the monies paid by you to us the Buyer's Premium, the Commission payable by the Seller in respect of the Lot, any Expenses and VAT and any interest earned and/or incurred until payment to the Seller.
- 3.6 Time will be of the essence in relation to any payment payable to us. If you do not pay the Purchase Price, or any other sum due to us in accordance with this paragraph 3, we will have the rights set out in paragraph 7 below.
- 3.7 Where a number of Lots have been knocked down to you, any monies we receive from you will be applied firstly pro-rata to pay the Purchase Price of each Lot and secondly pro-rata to pay all amounts due to *Bonhams*.

4 COLLECTION OF THE LOT

- 4.1 Subject to any power of the Seller or us to refuse to release the Lot to you, once you have paid to us, in cleared funds, everything due to the Seller and to us, we will release the Lot to you or as you may direct us in writing. The Lot will only be released on production of a buyer collection document, obtained from our cashier's office.
- 4.2 You must collect and remove the Lot at your own expense by the date and time specified in the *Notice to Bidders*, or if no date is specified, by 4.30pm on the seventh day after the Sale.
- 4.3 For the period referred to in paragraph 4.2, the Lot can be collected from the address referred to in the *Notice to Bidders* for collection on the days and times specified in the *Notice to Bidders*. Thereafter, the Lot may be removed elsewhere for storage and you must enquire from us as to when and where you can collect it, although this information will usually be set out in the *Notice to Bidders*.

- 4.4 If you have not collected the Lot by the date specified in the *Notice to Bidders*, you authorise us, acting as your agent and on your behalf, to enter into a contract (the "*Storage Contract*") with the *Storage Contractor* for the storage of the Lot on the then current standard terms and conditions agreed between *Bonhams* and the *Storage Contractor* (copies of which are available on request). If the Lot is stored at our premises storage fees at our current daily rates (currently a minimum of £3 plus VAT per Lot per day) will be payable from the expiry of the period referred to in paragraph 4.2. These storage fees form part of our Expenses.

within 20 days of the date of the relevant *Sale* (or such longer period as we may agree in writing) you return the *Lot* to us in the same condition as it was at the time of the *Sale*, accompanied by written evidence that the *Lot* is a non-conforming *Lot* and details of the *Sale* and *Lot* number sufficient to identify the *Lot*.

the *Lot* comprises atlases, maps, autographs, manuscripts, extra illustrated books, music or periodical publications; or

the *Lot* was listed in the *Catalogue* under "collections" or "collections and various" or the *Lot* was stated in the *Catalogue* to comprise or contain a collection, issue or *Books* which are undescribed or the missing text or illustrations are referred to or the relevant parts of the *Book* contain blanks, half titles or advertisements.

If we are reasonably satisfied that a *Lot* is a non-conforming *Lot*, we will (as principal) purchase the *Lot* from you and you will transfer the title to the *Lot* in question to us, with full title guarantee, free from any liens, charges, encumbrances and adverse claims and we will pay to you an amount equal to the sum of the *Purchase Price* and *Buyer's Premium* paid by you in respect of the *Lot*.

The benefit of paragraph 10 is personal to, and incapable of assignment by, you and if you sell or otherwise dispose of your interest in the *Lot*, all rights and benefits under this paragraph will cease.

12 MISCELLANEOUS

12.1 You may not assign either the benefit or burden of this agreement.

12.2 Our failure or delay in enforcing or exercising any power or right under this agreement will not operate or be deemed to operate as a waiver of our rights under it except to the extent of any express waiver given to you in writing. Any such waiver will not affect our ability subsequently to enforce any right arising under this agreement.

12.3 If either party to this agreement is prevented from performing that party's respective obligations under this agreement by circumstances beyond its reasonable control or if performance of its obligations would by reason of such circumstances give rise to a significantly increased financial cost to it, that party will not, for so long as such circumstances prevail, be required to perform such obligations. This paragraph does not apply to the obligations imposed on you by paragraph 3.

12.4 Any notice or other communication to be given under this agreement must be in writing and may be delivered by hand or sent by first class post or air mail or fax transmission (if to *Bonhams* marked for the attention of the Company Secretary), to the address or fax number of the relevant party given in the *Contract Form* (unless notice of any change of address is given in writing). It is the responsibility of the sender of the notice or communication to ensure that it is received in a legible form within any applicable time period.

12.5 If any term or any part of any term of this agreement is held to be unenforceable or invalid, such unenforceability or invalidity will not affect the enforceability and validity of the remaining terms or the remainder of the relevant term.

12.6 References in this agreement to *Bonhams* will, where appropriate, include reference to *Bonhams'* officers, employees and agents.

12.7 The headings used in this agreement are for convenience only and will not affect its interpretation.

12.8 In this agreement "including" means "including, without limitation".

12.9 References to the singular will include reference to the plural (and vice versa) and reference to any one gender will include reference to the other genders.

12.10 Reference to a numbered paragraph is to a paragraph of this agreement.

12.11 Save as expressly provided in paragraph 12.12 nothing in this agreement confers (or purports to confer) on any person who is not a party to this agreement any benefit conferred by, or the right to enforce any term of, this agreement.

12.12 Where this agreement confers an immunity from, and/or an exclusion or restriction of, the responsibility and/or liability of *Bonhams*, it will also operate in favour and for the benefit of *Bonhams'* holding company and the subsidiaries of such holding company and the successors and assigns of *Bonhams* and of such companies and of any officer, employee and agent of *Bonhams* and such companies, each of whom will be entitled to rely on the relevant immunity and/or exclusion and/or restriction within and for the purposes of Contracts (Rights of Third Parties) Act 1999, which enables the benefit of a contract to be extended to a person who is not a party to the contract, and generally at law.

13 GOVERNING LAW

All transactions to which this agreement applies and all connected matters will be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of that part of the United Kingdom where the *Sale* takes (or is to take) place and we and you each submit to the exclusive jurisdiction of the courts of that part of the United Kingdom, save that we may bring proceedings against you in any other court of competent jurisdiction to the extent permitted by the laws of the relevant jurisdiction. *Bonhams* has a complaints procedure in place.

APPENDIX 3

DEFINITIONS AND GLOSSARY

Where these Definitions and Glossary are incorporated, the following words and phrases used have (unless the context otherwise requires) the meanings given to them below. The Glossary is to assist you to understand words and phrases which have a specific legal meaning with which you may not be familiar.

LIST OF DEFINITIONS

"Additional Premium" a premium, calculated in accordance with the *Notice to Bidders*, to cover *Bonhams'* Expenses relating to the payment of royalties under the Artists Resale Right Regulations 2006 which is payable by the *Buyer* to *Bonhams* on any *Lot* marked [AR] which sells for a *Hammer Price* which together with the *Buyer's Premium* (but excluding any VAT) equals or exceeds 1000 euros (converted into the currency of the *Sale* using the European Central Bank Reference rate prevailing on the date of the *Sale*).
"Auctioneer" the representative of *Bonhams* conducting the *Sale*.

"Bidder" a person who has completed a *Bidding Form*.

"Bidding Form" our Bidding Registration Form, our Absentee Bidding Form or our Telephone Bidding Form.

"Bonhams" Bonhams 1793 Limited or its successors or assigns. *Bonhams* is also referred to in the *Buyer's Agreement*, the Conditions of Business and the *Notice to Bidders* by the words "we", "us" and "our".

"Book" a printed *Book* offered for *Sale* at a specialist *Book Sale*.

"Business" includes any trade, *Business* and profession.

"Buyer" the person to whom a *Lot* is knocked down by the *Auctioneer*. The *Buyer* is also referred to in the *Contract for Sale* and the *Buyer's Agreement* by the words "you" and "your".

"Buyer's Agreement" the contract entered into by *Bonhams* with the *Buyer* (see Appendix 2 in the *Catalogue*).

"Buyer's Premium" the sum calculated on the *Hammer Price* at the rates stated in the *Notice to Bidders*.

"Catalogue" the *Catalogue* relating to the relevant *Sale*, including any representation of the *Catalogue* published on our *Website*.

"Commission" the *Commission* payable by the *Seller* to *Bonhams* calculated at the rates stated in the *Contract Form*.

"Condition Report" a report on the physical condition of a *Lot* provided to a *Bidder* or potential *Bidder* by *Bonhams* on behalf of the *Seller*.

"Conditions of Sale" the *Notice to Bidders*, *Contract for Sale*, *Buyer's Agreement* and Definitions and Glossary.

"Consignment Fee" a fee payable to *Bonhams* by the *Seller* calculated at rates set out in the Conditions of Business.

"Consumer" a natural person who is acting for the relevant purpose outside his trade, *Business* or profession.

"Contract Form" the *Contract Form*, or vehicle *Entry* form, as applicable, signed by or on behalf of the *Seller* listing the *Lots* to be offered for *Sale* by *Bonhams*.

"Contract for Sale" the *Sale* contract entered into by the *Seller* with the *Buyer* (see Appendix 1 in the *Catalogue*).

"Contractual Description" the only *Description* of the *Lot* (being that part of the *Entry* about the *Lot* in the *Catalogue* which is in bold letters, any photograph (except for the colour) and the contents of any *Condition Report*) to which the *Seller* undertakes in the *Contract of Sale* the *Lot* corresponds.

"Description" any statement or representation in any way descriptive of the *Lot*, including any statement or representation relating to its authorship, attribution, condition, provenance, authenticity, style, period, age, suitability, quality, origin, value, estimated selling price (including the *Hammer Price*).

"Entry" a written statement in the *Catalogue* identifying the *Lot* and its *Lot* number which may contain a *Description* and illustration(s) relating to the *Lot*.

"Estimate" a statement of our opinion of the range within which the hammer is likely to fall.

"Expenses" charges and *Expenses* paid or payable by *Bonhams* in respect of the *Lot* including legal *Expenses*, banking charges and *Expenses* incurred as a result of an electronic transfer of money, charges and *Expenses* for loss and damage cover, insurance, *Catalogue* and other reproductions and illustrations, any customs duties, advertising, packing or shipping costs, reproductions rights' fees, taxes, levies, costs of testing, searches or enquiries, preparation of the *Lot* for *Sale*, storage charges, removal charges, removal charges or costs of collection from the *Seller* as the *Seller's* agents or from a defaulting *Buyer*, plus *VAT* if applicable.

"Forgery" an imitation intended by the maker or any other person to deceive as to authorship, attribution, origin, authenticity, style, date, age, period, provenance, culture, source or composition, which at the date of the *Sale* had a value materially less than it would have had if the *Lot* had not been such an imitation, and which is not stated to be such an imitation in any description of the *Lot*. A *Lot* will not be a *Forgery* by reason of any damage to, and/or restoration and/or modification work (including repainting or over painting) having been carried out on the *Lot*, where that damage, restoration or modification work (as the case may be) does not substantially affect the identity of the *Lot* as one conforming to the *Description* of the *Lot*.

"Guarantee" the obligation undertaken personally by *Bonhams* to the *Buyer* in respect of any *Forgery* and, in the case of specialist *Stamp Sales* and/or specialist *Book Sales*, a *Lot* made up of a *Stamp* or *Stamps* or a *Book* or *Books* as set out in the *Buyer's Agreement*.

"Hammer Price" the price in the currency in which the *Sale* is conducted at which a *Lot* is knocked down by the *Auctioneer*.

"Loss and Damage Warranty" means the warranty described in paragraph 8.2 of the Conditions of Business.

"Loss and Damage Warranty Fee" means the fee described in paragraph 8.2.3 of the Conditions of Business.

"Lot" any item consigned to *Bonhams* with a view to its *Sale* at auction or by private treaty (and reference to any *Lot* will include, unless the context otherwise requires, reference to individual items comprised in a group of two or more items offered for *Sale* as one *Lot*).

"Motoring Catalogue Fee" a fee payable by the *Seller* to *Bonhams* in consideration of the additional work undertaken by *Bonhams* in respect of the cataloguing of motor vehicles and in respect of the promotion of *Sales* of motor vehicles.

"New Bond Street" means *Bonhams'* saleroom at 101 New Bond Street, London W1S 1SR.

"Notional Charges" the amount of *Commission* and *VAT* which would have been payable if the *Lot* had been sold at the *Notional Price*.

"Notional Fee" the sum on which the *Consignment Fee* payable to *Bonhams* by the *Seller* is based and which is calculated according to the formula set out in the Conditions of Business.

"Notional Price" the latest in time of the average of the high and low *Estimates* given by us to you or stated in the *Catalogue* or, if no such *Estimates* have been given or stated, the *Reserve* applicable to the *Lot*.

"Notice to Bidders" the notice printed at the back or front of our *Catalogues*.

"Purchase Price" the aggregate of the *Hammer Price* and *VAT* on the *Hammer Price* (where applicable), the *Buyer's Premium* and *VAT* on the *Buyer's Premium* and any *Expenses*.

"Reserve" the minimum price at which a *Lot* may be sold (whether at auction or by private treaty).

"Sale" the auction *Sale* at which a *Lot* is to be offered for *Sale* by *Bonhams*.

"Sale Proceeds" the net amount due to the *Seller* from the *Sale* of a *Lot*, being the *Hammer Price* less the *Commission*, any *VAT* chargeable thereon, *Expenses* and any other amount due to us in whatever capacity and howsoever arising.

"Seller" the person who offers the *Lot* for *Sale* named on the *Contract Form*. Where the person so named identifies on the form another person as acting as his agent, or where the person named on the *Contract Form* acts as an agent for a principal (whether such agency is disclosed to *Bonhams* or not), "Seller" includes both the agent and the principal who shall be jointly and severally liable as such. "Standard Examination" a visual examination of a *Lot* by a non-specialist member of *Bonhams'* staff.

"Storage Contractor" means the company identified as such in the *Catalogue*.

"Terrorism" means any act or threatened act of terrorism, whether any person is acting alone or on behalf of or in connection with any organisation(s) and/or government(s), committed for political, religious or ideological or similar purposes including, but not limited to, the intention to influence any government and/or put the public or any section of the public into fear.

"Trust Account" the bank account of *Bonhams* into which all sums received in respect of the *Purchase Price* of any *Lot* will be paid, such account to be a distinct and separate account to *Bonhams'* normal business bank account.

"VAT" value added tax at the prevailing rate at the date of the *Sale* in the United Kingdom.

"Website" *Bonhams Website* at www.bonhams.com

"Withdrawal Notice" the *Seller's* written notice to *Bonhams* revoking *Bonhams'* instructions to sell a *Lot*.

"Without Reserve" where there is no minimum price at which a *Lot* may be sold (whether at auction or by private treaty).

GLOSSARY

The following expressions have specific legal meanings with which you may not be familiar. The following glossary is intended to give you an understanding of those expressions but is not intended to limit their legal meanings:

"artist's resale right": the right of the creator of a work of art to receive a payment on *Sales* of that work subsequent to the original *Sale* of that work by the creator of it as set out in the Artists Resale Right Regulations 2006.

"bailee": a person to whom goods are entrusted.

"indemnity": an obligation to put the person who has the benefit of the indemnity in the same position in which he would have been, had the circumstances giving rise to the indemnity not arisen and the expression "indemnify" is construed accordingly.

"interpleader proceedings": proceedings in the Courts to determine ownership or rights over a *Lot*.

"knocked down": when a *Lot* is sold to a *Bidder*, indicated by the fall of the hammer at the *Sale*.

"lien": a right for the person who has possession of the *Lot* to retain possession of it.

"risk": the possibility that a *Lot* may be lost, damaged, destroyed, stolen, or deteriorate in condition or value.

"title": the legal and equitable right to the ownership of a *Lot*.

"tort": a legal wrong done to someone to whom the wrong doer has a duty of care.

SALE OF GOODS ACT 1979

The following is an extract from the Sale of Goods Act 1979:

"Section 12 Implied terms about title, etc

- (1) In a contract of sale, other than one to which subsection (3) below applies, there is an implied term on the part of the seller that in the case of a sale he has a right to sell the goods, and in the case of an agreement to sell he will have such a right at the time when the property is to pass.
- (2) In a contract of sale, other than one to which subsection (3) below applies, there is also an implied term that:
 - (a) the goods are free, and will remain free until the time when the property is to pass, from any charge or encumbrance not disclosed or known to the buyer before the contract is made, and
 - (b) the buyer will enjoy quiet possession of the goods except in so far as it may be disturbed by the owner or other person entitled to the benefit of any charge or encumbrance so disclosed or known.
- (3) This subsection applies to a contract of sale in the case of which there appears from the contract or is to be inferred from its circumstances an intention that the seller should transfer only such title as he or a third person may have.
- (4) In a contract to which subsection (3) above applies there is an implied term that all charges or encumbrances known to the seller and not known to the buyer have been disclosed to the buyer before the contract is made.
- (5) In a contract to which subsection (3) above applies there is also an implied term that none of the following will disturb the buyer's quiet possession of the goods, namely:
 - (a) the seller;
 - (b) in a case where the parties to the contract intend that the seller should transfer only such title as a third person may have, that person;
 - (c) anyone claiming through or under the seller or that third person otherwise than under a charge or encumbrance disclosed or known to the buyer before the contract is made.
- (5A) As regards England and Wales and Northern Ireland, the term implied by subsection (1) above is a condition and the terms implied by subsections (2), (4) and (5) above are warranties."
