



THE ESTATE OF UTA PEARSON

Bonhams is honoured to offer the following collection of jewellery from the Estate of Uta Pearson.

Uta was a celebrated international fashion model during the 1960s. Born in Germany, and educated in Switzerland and the United Kingdom, Uta led the life of a glamorous global nomad. An unmistakeable beauty, Uta's 'Bond Girl' looks were matched by a distinguished sense of style, a keen eye for fashion and unique pieces of jewellery.

Uta's modelling took her all over the world during the 1960s and 1970s. It was during her many travels, and her residencies in Switzerland, the United Kingdom and the United States, that Uta bought and traded fine jewels and exquisite antique Chinese robes. She developed an expert eye for quality and originality. By the time Uta had settled in Australia, she had amassed a significant and diverse collection of antique, retro, ethnic and contemporary jewels from international dealers and auction houses. She continued collecting and buying from auction sales until late in her life.

In addition to her strong interest in antiques, jewellery and fashion, Uta's primary passion during her lifetime was wildlife conservation. She participated in fundraising for various conservation trusts and charities throughout her life.

Uta's love of wildlife and animals is embodied in this wonderful and eclectic collection of jewellery which carries a definite naturalistic theme throughout including, antique diamond butterfly brooches and spiders, snake bracelets, Art Nouveau diamond encrusted bats, and rings modelled as coloured diamond animals.





Historically many gemstones have been subjected to a variety of treatments to enhance their appearance. Sapphires and rubies are routinely heat treated to improve their colour and clarity, similarly emeralds are frequently treated with oils or resin for the same purpose. - 12.2.3 any other dispute relating to or arising out of the sale of the *Lot* or this agreement shall be finally resolved, if so required by Bonhams, by arbitration, under the UNCITRAL arbitration rules in force at the date of the reference to the arbitration, and the tribunal for such arbitration will consist of a single arbitrator appointed, in the absence of agreement between the Seller, you and (if applicable) Bonhams, by the President of The Law Society of New South Wales from time to time. The arbitration will take place in Sydney and all proceedings (whether oral or written) will be conducted in the English language:
- 12.2.4 all costs and fees incurred in connection with the resolution of a dispute in accordance with paragraph 11.2 will be borne by the *Seller* and *Buyer* in such manner as the expert(s) or the arbitrator, as the case may be, determines.

Subject to this, we will not disclose your data to any third party but we may from time to time provide you with information about goods and services provided by third parties which we feel may be of interest to you. Any member of our group may use your data for similar purposes

We will keep your data for a period of six years from the date of your last contact with us so as to simplify any future registration. The data may be transferred to and stored outside Australia, particularly the United Kingdom, and you agree to this transfer. Even when information is stored outside Australia, we will continue to comply with the National Privacy Principles set out in the Australian Privacy Act.

- "Estimate" a statement of our opinion of the range within which the hammer is likely to fall.
- "Expenses" charges and expenses paid or payable by Bonhams in respect of the Lot including legal expenses, banking charges and expenses incurred as a result of an electronic transfer of money, charges and expenses for loss and damage cover, catalogue and other reproductions and illustrations, any customs duties, advertising, packing or shipping costs, reproduction rights' fees, taxes (including GST), levies, costs of testing, searches or enquiries, preparation of the *Lot* for sale, storage charges, removal charges or costs of collection from the Seller as the Seller's agents or from a defaulting Buyer, plus GST if applicable.

A Lot will not be a Forgery by reason of any damage to, and/or restoration and/or modification work (including repainting or over painting) having been carried out on the *Lot*, where that damage, restoration or modification work (as the case may be) does not substantially affect the identity of the *Lot* as one conforming to the description of the Lot.
- "GST" means the same as GST means in the A New Tax System (Goods and Services Tax) Act 1999. "Guarantee" the obligation undertaken personally by
- Bonhams to the Buyer in respect of any Forgery and, in the case of specialist Stamp sales and/or specialist Book sales, a *Lot* made up of a Stamp or Stamps or a Book or Books as set out

- "Motoring Catalogue Fee" a fee payable by the Seller to Bonhams in consideration of the additional work undertaken by Bonhams in respect of the cataloguing of motor vehicles
