Breitling created the Unitime as a watch to fill the needs of people using primarily 24 hour units for time. These dials take a little getting used to as 12 midday with a casual glance would read 6 o'clock on a conventional watch. Another unusual feature is the asymmetric dial with the larger minute recording subdial completing the quirky nature and look of this watch. The production numbers of this lies in between numbers 1276xxx and 1277xxx meaning less than 1000 were ever made and due to its unusual function probably less than that.

The Rolex Daytona continues to be among the most sought after vintage watches on the market today. The bold contrast between the dial colour and the subsidiary dials makes this model instantly recognisable and as such it has long been lauded as a design icon. Both references 6263 and 6265 were launched in 1969, thus replacing the first Oyster Cosmograph 6240. The 6263, a stainless steel model with screw-down pushers remained in production for nearly 20 years.

In 1965 Edward Higgins 'Ed' White (1930-1967) was the first American to 'walk in space'. The Omega ref.105.003 has been coined the 'Ed White' as it was on the wrist of White during this historic milestone in space exploration.

The production period of the 105.003 was very short, lasting around 3 years from 1963. In 1966 it was superseded by the 'Professional' ref.105.012 famously worn on the moon in 1969. Features that typify the pre-moon Speedmaster are the lack of Professional to the dial, a symmetrical case, no crown guards and straight lugs.

The success of the Carrera model inspired Jack Heuer's innovative and creative spirit to introduce a Carrera in 1966 with a date wheel. This first chronograph with a date window was developed mainly for the US market and was advertised with the slogan: 'a wristwatch, a stopwatch and a calendar, too'.

The first version of the Carrera 3147 had a date window at 12 O'clock and was only produced for one year. The current lot features the dial configuration of the second version with the date aperture moved to 9 O'clock. This new arrangement gave the watch an asymmetric modern twist to the dial which is highly popular with collectors today.

Introduced in 1995 the 5004 was based on the reference 3970 perpetual calendar chronograph, the successor to the iconic 2499.

Adding the split second function to the already highly intricate calibre 27-70 required a total of 407 hand finished components, making it one of the most complicated Patek Philippes ever produced. It is believed only 12 examples were manufactured each year before being discontinued in 2009, although a short run of an additional 50 examples was produced in stainless steel in 2011.

Since superseded by the larger reference 5204 and the cushion shaped single button chronograph 5951, the 5004 represents one of the finest examples of understated haute horology due to its compact dimensions and conservative design. Considered by many collectors to be the ultimate execution of the chronograph complication from one of the greatest manufacturers, the 5004 has only increased in desirability since the last examples were produced.

This particular example offered in the attractive classic combination of silvered dial with Arabic numerals, dates from the first series of production with a movement number between 879501 and 879999.

*'To carry a fine Breguet watch  
is to feel that you have the brains  
of a Genius in your pocket'*

- Sir David Solomon

Abraham Louis Breguet was the best known Horologist of his time, his watches were worn by nobility and influential people of the time. Breguet traversed some of the most turbulent in France's history but his Genius bridged the divides of countries. He sold to Napoleon one day and The Duke of Wellington the next. Marie Antoinette was a great admirer of Breguet, she ordered one of the very first self winding watches he created and was delivered her last Breguet watch in Prison before she was executed in the bloodbath of the French revolution. Breguet's greatest watch the famous no.106 with a total of 23 complications was made for her but sadly not finished in time to be delivered to the Queen or indeed before Breguet himself died but still bears her name.

It is maybe a measure of the profound desire to own a Breguet watch is that one of the greatest Heists of the 20th century was to steal The Sir David Solomons collection. A heist that remained unsolved until 2007 when a large portion of the watches were offered back to the L A Mayer Museum in Jerusalem from (it was later discovered) the widow of the infamous master thief Na'Aman Diller. Leading a life stranger than fiction it turns out he stole these watches not for profit or under instruction but to have and study them. Each was discovered to have complex notes regarding the mechanisms written by Diller himself meaning he spent time with them and was fascinated by the intricacies. The stolen watches were stored in various banks, he took care of them for the entirety of his life.

Breguet's influence in the world of watches is unfathomable and profound, not only do some of his inventions and improvements continue to be used today in modern watch production, he has inspired many generations of true watchmakers in their designs and passion for the subject. Some of the greatest living watchmakers would list Breguet as an influence to their work and lives as Horologists.

Here we have a rare chance to own some of his pieces with a group that includes two rare and very different Lever escapements and the unmistakable simplicity of his quintessential Souscription watch which is definitely a defining watch of the 19th Century and beyond. It is not often you see one Abraham Louis Breguet watch but to be able to see and compare a group such as this is an opportunity not to be missed.

Breguet did not settle on one type of escapement for his watches although he favoured the cylinder escapement and therefore the lever is not the most commonly used by him. He could see that the lever escapement had many benefits and in this watch he used the Lateral lever. This version of the lever was mostly used by the English and maybe because of Breguet's close connections with Arnold it made this a natural choice before he started to develop it to his own design.



After Abraham Louis Breguet returned from exile back to Paris in the 1790's his business was virtually destroyed. He came up with a plan whereby his clients could order a watch paying a down payment and then the balance when the watch was delivered. This founded the business and allowed him to rebuild. These watches were known as 'Souscription' watches and indeed the dial of this watch is unusually scratch signed with the word Souscription as well as the more traditional 'Breguet' and number. This represents the final development of the Souscription giving it a greater elegance and finesse than some of the earlier pieces. Each of these watches is in some way unique as each was finished by hand with a certain amount of freedom given to the watchmaker.

This is a beautifully made watch of relatively large diameter (61mm), with a single hand and enamel dial, the movement is of great simplicity based around a large central barrel and symmetrical layout to the wheels. To this design Breguet added his special features like the parachute shock resist system and the underslung ruby cylinder which were all his own advances in horology.

This watch was included in the Lord Raglan collection and was the property of the Marquess of Londonderry. Originally when this was bought it was already a very expensive watch indicating that it included many of Breguet's inventions and perfections for watches. One of the rarest and most remarkable is the use of the Straight line lever escapement. This was an adaptation of the lateral lever escapement used by the English and by Breguet himself in earlier watches. (See lot 61). This version was in time adopted by horology as a whole and forms the base of most modern mechanical watches today.

Rarer still is the use of oil retention holes in the teeth of the escape wheel. Breguet flirted with ideas for extending the life of the oil by placing a conical reservoir for the oil leading on each tooth. Expensive and not very effective it did not become a regular feature in his watches.





## **ERIC CLAPTON**

Eric Clapton CBE is recognised as one of the world's most influential guitarists, playing with bands like the Yardbirds, Cream, Derek and the Dominoes as well as a Solo career with songs like Layla, maintaining his presence throughout his career. The Patek Philippe Reference 3417 was the first anti-magnetic watch produced in series and was introduced to the world in 1958. In 1960 the original calibre 12-400 was replaced by calibre 27-AM400 with improved timekeeping and anti-magnetism. This was made until 1969 changing the balance frequency from 18000A/h to 19800 A/h with a bronze beryllium straight-line lever escapement and Gyromax balance wheel. The serial numbers for this calibre are from 730000 to 735239 and 739700 to 739799.

With regards to the Magnetic field test report from Patek Philippe, the reference 3417 is made for preventing strong electromagnetic inference up to 450 oersteds. The report also stated that it would take a magnetic field of 1200 oersteds to stop the "Amagnetic" watch, and outside of such a field, the watch will run again and will gain approximately 30 seconds in 24 hours. A process of demagnetizing will eliminate this gain. At the time of production, Patek Philippe offered on special request a movement that would be manufactured with a double shielding, to offer additional protection against strong magnetic fields. The result was known to be the best in the period.

The Heuer Autavia model was introduced in 1962, the name deriving from a combination of "AUTomobile" and "AVIation".

Nicknamed after the Austrian Formula 1 driver, Jochen Rindt (18 April 1942 – 5 September 1970) was famously known for his daring driving and passion for the sport. Whilst practicing for the 1970 Italian Grand Prix he lost control of his Lotus 72 and unexpectedly hit the guardrail with fatal consequences. Despite there being 4 more races to complete Rindts competitors of the day were unable to score more points and he remains the only Formula 1 driver to posthumously be awarded World Champion.

Up until his fatal accident Rindt was regularly pictured wearing his Autavia which was a third execution 2446 featuring three silvered registers and a bezel with 12 hour markers.

If you stood with your eyes closed and listened, you would imagine a jet fighter taking off in front of you. When you open your eyes you would see a road legal motorbike going past, albeit very very fast. In actual fact faster than any bike in its class before or since.

On the 15th of May 2016 the Mad Max Turbine bike shot into the record books as the fastest Turbine bike clocking a speed of 231.6 miles per hour over a mile. A Speed that creates such wind resistance that Zef's Helmet feels like it weighs 80KG, one twist to the side and it would be a very uncomfortable experience. The bike uses a Rolls Royce C20W engine to generate the power in a safe and usable form expertly engineered by the team to manage the massive horse power in a manner that can be controlled into a rideable bike.

TAG Heuer joined the party early and sponsored the team, in 2011 they used the turbine bike covered in an amazing Vinyl in the style and manner of TAG Heuer's most Avant-Garde timepiece the V4 (lot 136), the drive mechanism used in both bike and watch. The TAG Heuer V4 was created with 4 barrels inter connected with a belt drive system, a Design dream that took 5 years to complete and remains one of the most unusual pieces to come from the TAG Heuer manufacture.

To commemorate the amazing achievement of the world record, TAG Heuer produced a very limited edition 'Turbina Carbon' (lot 137), the design used many of the design features such as the red highlights and the black carbon body on the bike and to set it apart has the iconic and rare bulls head case with the chronograph, crown and pushers situated at the top of the watch.

Using the Turbine Street fighter bike pictured with Lot 139 as a promotional tool, Tag Heuer kept connection to the team with the promotion of the world's most accurate mechanical time piece. The Mikrotimer Flying 100 (lot 139) measures 1000ths of a second and was developed to use a two train movement ending in two distinct balances. The fastest of which is used as a chronograph reminiscent of the independent chronograph watches from the 19th century but taken to the most extreme with the seemingly wildly spinning centre seconds hand controlled to measure the minutest time possible for a mechanical chronograph wristwatch.

The Sea-Dweller and the Submariner models were all used by the French diving company Comex (Compagnie Maritime d' Expertise) and were issued to their specialist divers with each watch marked Comex on the dial and numbered on the rear.

### Proof of Firearms

Barrels of guns sold as parts will only be made available for sleeving and measurements once rendered unserviceable according to the Gun Barrel Proof Act of 1968 to 1978 and the Rules of Proof.

### Condition of Firearms

Comment in this *Catalogue* is restricted, in general, to

exceptional condition and to those defects that might affect the immediate safety of a firearm in normal use. An intending *Bidder* unable to make technical examinations and assessments is recommended to seek advice from a gunmaker or from a modern firearms specialist. - The date given is that of the image (negative). Where no further date is given, this indicates that the photographic print is vintage (the term "vintage" may also be included in the *Lot Description*). A vintage photograph is one which was made within approximately 5-10 years of the negative. Where a second, later date appears, this refers to the date of printing. Where the exact printing date is not known, but understood to be later, "printed later" will appear in the *Lot Description*.

- "Manner of Jacopo Bassano": in our opinion a work in the style of the artist and of a later date;
- "After Jacopo Bassano": in our opinion, a copy of a known work of the artist;
- "Signed and/or dated and/or inscribed": in our opinion the signature and/or date and/or inscription are from the hand of the artist;
- "Bears a signature and/or date and/or inscription": in our opinion the signature and/or date and/or inscription have been added by another hand.

## 22. PORCELAIN AND GLASS

### Damage and Restoration

For your guidance, in our *Catalogues* we detail, as far as practicable, recorded all significant defects, cracks and restoration. Such practicable *Descriptions* of damage cannot be definitive, and in providing *Condition Reports*, we cannot *Guarantee* that there are no other defects present which have not been mentioned. *Bidders* should satisfy themselves by inspection, as to the condition of each *Lot*. ## 24. WINE

*Lots* which are lying under Bond and those liable to VAT may not be available for immediate collection.

### Examining the wines

It is occasionally possible to provide a pre-Sale tasting for larger parcels (as defined below). This is generally limited to more recent and everyday drinking wines. Please contact the department for details.

It is not our policy to inspect every unopened case. In the case of wines older than 20 years the boxes will usually have been opened and levels and appearance noted in the *Catalogue* where necessary. You should make proper allowance for variations in ullage levels and conditions of corks, capsules and labels.

### Corks and Ullages

Ullage refers to the space between the base of the cork and the wine. Ullage levels for Bordeaux shaped bottles are only normally noted when below the neck and for Burgundy, Alsace, German and Cognac shaped bottles when greater than 4 centimetres (cm). Acceptable ullage levels increase with age; generally acceptable levels are as follows:

Under 15 years old – into neck or less than 4cm  
15 to 30 years old – top shoulder (ts) or up to 5cm  
Over 30 years old – high shoulder (hs) or up to 6cm

It should be noted that ullages may change between publication of the *Catalogue* and the *Sale* and that corks may fail as a result of transporting the wine. We will only accept responsibility for *Descriptions* of condition at the time of publication of the *Catalogue* and cannot accept responsibility for any loss resulting from failure of corks either before or after this point.

### Options to buy parcels

A parcel is a number of *Lots* of identical size of the same wine, bottle size and *Description*. The *Buyer* of any of these *Lots* has the option to accept some or all of the remaining *Lots* in the parcel at the same price, although such options will be at the *Auctioneer's* sole discretion. Under this contract the *Seller's* liability in respect of the quality of the *Lot*, it's fitness for any purpose and its conformity with any *Description* is limited. You are strongly advised to examine the *Lot* for yourself and/or obtain an independent examination of it before you buy it.

1 THE CONTRACT

- 1.1 These terms govern the *Contract for Sale* of the *Lot* by the *Seller* to the *Buyer*.
- 1.2 The Definitions and Glossary contained in Appendix 3 in the *Catalogue* are incorporated into this *Contract for Sale* and a separate copy can also be provided by *Bonhams* on request. Where words and phrases are used which are in the List of Definitions, they are printed in italics.
- 1.3 The *Seller* sells the *Lot* as the principal to the *Contract for Sale*, such contract being made between the *Seller* and you through *Bonhams* which acts in the sole capacity as the *Seller's* agent and not as an additional principal. - 5.2 Title to the *Lot* remains in and is retained by the *Seller* until the *Purchase Price* and all other sums payable by you to *Bonhams* in relation to the *Lot* have been paid in full to, and received in cleared funds by, *Bonhams*.

6 PAYMENT

BUYER'S AGREEMENT

**IMPORTANT:** These terms may be changed in advance of the Sale of the Lot to you, by the setting out of different terms in the Catalogue for the Sale and/or by placing an insert in the Catalogue and/or by notices at the Sale venue and/or by oral announcements before and during the Sale at the Sale venue. You should be alert to this possibility of changes and ask in advance of bidding if there have been any.

1 THE CONTRACT

- 1.1

These terms govern the contract between Bonhams personally and the Buyer, being the person to whom a Lot has been knocked down by the Auctioneer.
- 1.2

The Definitions and Glossary contained in Appendix 3 to the Catalogue for the Sale are incorporated into this agreement and a separate copy can also be provided by us on request. Where words and phrases which are defined in the List of Definitions are used in this agreement, they are printed in italics. Reference is made in this agreement to information printed in the Notice to Bidders, printed in the Catalogue for the Sale, and where such information is referred to it is incorporated into this agreement.
- 1.3

Except as specified in paragraph 4 of the Notice to Bidders the Contract for Sale of the Lot between you and the Seller is made on the fall of the Auctioneer's hammer in respect of the Lot, when it is knocked down to you. At that moment a separate contract is also made between you and Bonhams on the terms in this Buyer's Agreement.
- 1.4

We act as agents for the Seller and are not answerable or personally responsible to you for any breach of contract or other default by the Seller, unless Bonhams sells the Lot as principal.
- 1.5

Our personal obligations to you are governed by this agreement and we agree, subject to the terms below, to the following obligations:
- 1.5.1

we will, until the date and time specified in the Notice to Bidders or otherwise notified to you, store the Lot in accordance with paragraph 5;
- 1.5.2

subject to any power of the Seller or us to refuse to release the Lot to you, we will release the Lot to you in accordance with paragraph 4 once you have paid to us, in cleared funds, everything due to us and the Seller;
- 1.5.3

we will provide guarantees in the terms set out in paragraphs 9 and 10.
- 1.6

We do not make or give and do not agree to make or give any contractual promise, undertaking, obligation, Guarantee, warranty, representation of fact in relation to any Description of the Lot or any Estimate in relation to it, nor of the accuracy or completeness of any Description or Estimate which may have been made by us or on our behalf or by or on behalf of the Seller (whether made orally or in writing, including in the Catalogue or on Bonhams' Website, or by conduct, or otherwise), and whether made before or after this agreement or prior to or during the Sale. No such Description or Estimate is incorporated into this agreement between you and us. Any such Description or Estimate, if made by us or on our behalf, was (unless Bonhams itself sells the Lot as principal) made as agent on behalf of the Seller.

2 PERFORMANCE OF THE CONTRACT FOR SALE

You undertake to us personally that you will observe and comply with all your obligations and undertakings to the Seller under the Contract for Sale in respect of the Lot.

3 PAYMENT

- 3.1

Unless agreed in writing between you and us or as otherwise set out in the Notice to Bidders, you must pay to us by not later than 4.30pm on the second working day following the Sale:
- 3.1.1

the Purchase Price for the Lot;
- 3.1.2

a Buyer's Premium in accordance with the rates set out in the Notice to Bidders on each lot, and
- 3.1.3

if the Lot is marked [A], an Additional Premium which is calculated and payable in accordance with the Notice to Bidders together with VAT on that sum if applicable so that all sums due to us are cleared funds by the seventh working day after the Sale.
- 3.2

You must also pay us on demand any Expenses payable pursuant to this agreement.
- 3.3

All payments to us must be made in the currency in which the Sale was conducted, using, unless otherwise agreed by us in writing, one of the methods of payment set out in the Notice to Bidders. Our invoices will only be addressed to the registered Bidder unless the Bidder is acting as an agent for a named principal and we have approved that arrangement, in which case we will address the invoice to the principal.
- 3.4

Unless otherwise stated in this agreement all sums payable to us will be subject to VAT at the appropriate rate and VAT will be payable by you on all such sums.
- 3.5

We may deduct and retain for our own benefit from the monies paid by you to us the Buyer's Premium, the Commission payable by the Seller in respect of the Lot, any Expenses and VAT and any interest earned and/or incurred until payment to the Seller.
- 3.6

Time will be of the essence in relation to any payment payable to us. If you do not pay the Purchase Price, or any other sum due to us in accordance with this paragraph 3, we will have the rights set out in paragraph 7 below.
- 3.7

Where a number of Lots have been knocked down to you, any monies we receive from you will be applied firstly pro-rata to pay the Purchase Price of each Lot and secondly pro-rata to pay all amounts due to Bonhams.

4 COLLECTION OF THE LOT

- 4.1

Subject to any power of the Seller or us to refuse to release the Lot to you, once you have paid to us, in cleared funds, everything due to the Seller and to us, we will release the Lot to you or as you may direct us in writing. The Lot will only be released on production of a buyer collection document, obtained from our cashier's office.
- 4.2

You must collect and remove the Lot at your own expense by the date and time specified in the Notice to Bidders, or if no date is specified, by 4.30pm on the seventh day after the Sale.

For the period referred to in paragraph 4.2, the Lot can be collected from the address referred to in the Notice to Bidders for collection on the days and times specified in the Notice to Bidders. Thereafter, the Lot may be removed elsewhere for storage and you must enquire from us as to when and where you can collect it, although this information will usually be set out in the Notice to Bidders.

- 4.4

If you have not collected the Lot by the date specified in the Notice to Bidders, you authorise us, acting as your agent and on your behalf, to enter into a contract (the "Storage Contract") with the Storage Contractor for the storage of the Lot on the then current standard terms and conditions agreed between Bonhams and the Storage Contractor (copies of which are available on request). If the Lot is stored at our premises storage fees at our current daily rates (currently a minimum of £3 plus VAT per Lot per day) will be payable from the expiry of the period referred to in paragraph 4.2. These storage fees form part of our Expenses.
- 4.5

5 STORING THE LOT

We agree to store the Lot until the earlier of your removal of the Lot or until the time and date set out in the Notice to Bidders, on the Sale Information Page or at the back of the catalogue (or if no date is specified, by 4.30pm on the seventh day after the Sale) and, subject to paragraphs 6 and 10, to be responsible as bailee to you for damage to or the loss or destruction of the Lot (notwithstanding that it is not your property before payment of the Purchase Price). If you do not collect the Lot before the time and date set out in the Notice to Bidders (or if no date is specified, by 4.30pm on the seventh day after the Sale) we may remove the Lot to another location, the details of which will usually be set out in the relevant section of the Catalogue. “**Book**” a printed *Book* offered for *Sale* at a specialist *Book Sale*.

“**Business**” includes any trade, *Business* and profession.

“**Buyer**” the person to whom a *Lot* is knocked down by the *Auctioneer*. The *Buyer* is also referred to in the *Contract for Sale* and the *Buyer's Agreement* by the words “you” and “your”.

“**Buyer's Agreement**” the contract entered into by *Bonhams* with the *Buyer* (see Appendix 2 in the *Catalogue*).

“**Buyer's Premium**” the sum calculated on the *Hammer Price* at the rates stated in the *Notice to Bidders*.

“**Catalogue**” the *Catalogue* relating to the relevant *Sale*, including any representation of the *Catalogue* published on our *Website*.

“**Commission**” the *Commission* payable by the *Seller* to *Bonhams* calculated at the rates stated in the *Contract Form*.

“**Condition Report**” a report on the physical condition of a *Lot* provided to a *Bidder* or potential *Bidder* by *Bonhams* on behalf of the *Seller*.

“**Conditions of Sale**” the *Notice to Bidders*, *Contract for Sale*, *Buyer's Agreement* and Definitions and Glossary.

“**Consignment Fee**” a fee payable to *Bonhams* by the *Seller* calculated at rates set out in the Conditions of Business.

“**Consumer**” a natural person who is acting for the relevant purpose outside his trade, *Business* or profession.

“**Contract Form**” the *Contract Form*, or vehicle *Entry form*, as applicable, signed by or on behalf of the *Seller* listing the *Lots* to be offered for *Sale* by *Bonhams*.

“**Contract for Sale**” the *Sale* contract entered into by the *Seller* with the *Buyer* (see Appendix 1 in the *Catalogue*).

“**Contractual Description**” the only *Description* of the *Lot* (being that part of the *Entry* about the *Lot* in the *Catalogue* which is in bold letters, any photograph (except for the colour) and the contents of any *Condition Report*) to which the *Seller* undertakes in the *Contract of Sale* the *Lot* corresponds.

“**Description**” any statement or representation in any way descriptive of the *Lot*, including any statement or representation relating to its authorship, attribution, condition, provenance, authenticity, style, period, age, suitability, quality, origin, value, estimated selling price (including the *Hammer Price*).

“**Entry**” a written statement in the *Catalogue* identifying the *Lot* and its *Lot* number which may contain a *Description* and illustration(s) relating to the *Lot*.

“**Estimate**” a statement of our opinion of the range within which the hammer is likely to fall.

“**Expenses**” charges and *Expenses* paid or payable by *Bonhams* in respect of the *Lot* including legal *Expenses*, banking charges and *Expenses* incurred as a result of an electronic transfer of money, charges and *Expenses* for loss and damage cover, insurance, *Catalogue* and other reproductions and illustrations, any customs duties, advertising, packing or shipping costs, reproductions rights’ fees, taxes, levies, costs of testing, searches or enquiries, preparation of the *Lot* for *Sale*, storage charges, removal charges, removal charges or costs of collection from the *Seller* as the *Seller's* agents or from a defaulting *Buyer*, plus *VAT* if applicable.

“**Forgery**” an imitation intended by the maker or any other person to deceive as to authorship, attribution, origin, authenticity, style, date, age, period, provenance, culture, source or composition, which at the date of the *Sale* had a value materially less than it would have had if the *Lot* had not been such an imitation, and which is not stated to be such an imitation in any description of the *Lot*. A *Lot* will not be a *Forgery* by reason of any damage to, and/or restoration and/or modification work (including repainting or over painting) having been carried out on the *Lot*, where that damage, restoration or modification work (as the case may be) does not substantially affect the identity of the *Lot* as one conforming to the *Description* of the *Lot*.

“**Guarantee**” the obligation undertaken personally by *Bonhams* to the *Buyer* in respect of any *Forgery* and, in the case of specialist *Stamp Sales* and/or specialist *Book Sales*, a *Lot* made up of a *Stamp* or *Stamps* or a *Book* or *Books* as set out in the *Buyer's Agreement*.

“**Hammer Price**” the price in the currency in which the *Sale* is conducted at which a *Lot* is knocked down by the *Auctioneer*.

“**Loss and Damage Warranty**” means the warranty described in paragraph 8.2 of the Conditions of Business.

“**Loss and Damage Warranty Fee**” means the fee described in paragraph 8.2.3 of the Conditions of Business.

“**Lot**” any item consigned to *Bonhams* with a view to its *Sale* at auction or by private treaty (and reference to any *Lot* will include, unless the context otherwise requires, reference to individual items comprised in a group of two or more items offered for *Sale* as one *Lot*).

“**Motoring Catalogue Fee**” a fee payable by the *Seller* to *Bonhams* in consideration of the additional work undertaken by *Bonhams* in respect of the cataloguing of motor vehicles and in respect of the promotion of *Sales* of motor vehicles.

“**New Bond Street**” means *Bonhams'* saleroom at 101 New Bond Street, London W1S 1SR.

“**Notional Charges**” the amount of *Commission* and *VAT* which would have been payable if the *Lot* had been sold at the *Notional Price*.

“**Notional Fee**” the sum on which the *Consignment Fee* payable to *Bonhams* by the *Seller* is based and which is calculated according to the formula set out in the Conditions of Business.

“**Notional Price**” the latest in time of the average of the high and low *Estimates* given by us to you or stated in the *Catalogue* or, if no such *Estimates* have been given or stated, the *Reserve* applicable to the *Lot*.

“**Notice to Bidders**” the notice printed at the back or front of our *Catalogues*.

“**Purchase Price**” the aggregate of the *Hammer Price* and *VAT* on the *Hammer Price* (where applicable), the *Buyer's Premium* and *VAT* on the *Buyer's Premium* and any *Expenses*.

“**Reserve**” the minimum price at which a *Lot* may be sold (whether at auction or by private treaty).

“**Sale**” the auction *Sale* at which a *Lot* is to be offered for *Sale* by *Bonhams*.

“**Sale Proceeds**” the net amount due to the *Seller* from the *Sale* of a *Lot*, being the *Hammer Price* less the *Commission*, any *VAT* chargeable thereon, *Expenses* and any other amount due to us in whatever capacity and howsoever arising.

“**Seller**” the person who offers the *Lot* for *Sale* named on the *Contract Form*. Where the person so named identifies on the form another person as acting as his agent, or where the person named on the *Contract Form* acts as an agent for a principal (whether such agency is disclosed to *Bonhams* or not), “*Seller*” includes both the agent and the principal who shall be jointly and severally liable as such. The *Seller* is also referred to in the Conditions of Business by the words “you” and “your”.

“**Specialist Examination**” a visual examination of a *Lot* by a specialist on the *Lot*.

“**Stamp**” means a postage *Stamp* offered for *Sale* at a Specialist *Stamp Sale*.

“**Standard Examination**” a visual examination of a *Lot* by a non-specialist member of *Bonhams'* staff.

“**Storage Contract**” means the contract described in paragraph 8.3.3 of the Conditions of Business or paragraph 4.4 of the *Buyer's Agreement* (as appropriate).

“**Storage Contractor**” means the company identified as such in the *Catalogue*.

“**Terrorism**” means any act or threatened act of terrorism, whether any person is acting alone or on behalf of or in connection with any organisation(s) and/or government(s), committed for political, religious or ideological or similar purposes including, but not limited to, the intention to influence any government and/or put the public or any section of the public into fear.

“**Trust Account**” the bank account of *Bonhams* into which all sums received in respect of the *Purchase Price* of any *Lot* will be paid, such account to be a distinct and separate account to *Bonhams'* normal business bank account.

“**VAT**” value added tax at the prevailing rate at the date of the *Sale* in the United Kingdom.

“**Website**” *Bonhams Website* at [www.bonhams.com](http://www.bonhams.com)

“**Withdrawal Notice**” the *Seller's* written notice to *Bonhams* revoking *Bonhams'* instructions to sell a *Lot*.

“**Without Reserve**” where there is no minimum price at which a *Lot* may be sold (whether at auction or by private treaty).

## GLOSSARY

The following expressions have specific legal meanings with which you may not be familiar. The following glossary is intended to give you an understanding of those expressions but is not intended to limit their legal meanings:

“**artist's resale right**”: the right of the creator of a work of art to receive a payment on *Sales* of that work subsequent to the original *Sale* of that work by the creator of it as set out in the Artists Resale Right Regulations 2006.

“**bailee**”: a person to whom goods are entrusted.

“**indemnity**”: an obligation to put the person who has the benefit of the indemnity in the same position in which he would have been, had the circumstances giving rise to the indemnity not arisen and the expression “indemnify” is construed accordingly.

“**interpleader proceedings**”: proceedings in the Courts to determine ownership or rights over a *Lot*.

“**knocked down**”: when a *Lot* is sold to a *Bidder*, indicated by the fall of the hammer at the *Sale*.

“**lien**”: a right for the person who has possession of the *Lot* to retain possession of it.

“**risk**”: the possibility that a *Lot* may be lost, damaged, destroyed, stolen, or deteriorate in condition or value.

“**title**”: the legal and equitable right to the ownership of a *Lot*.

“**tort**”: a legal wrong done to someone to whom the wrong doer has a duty of care.

## SALE OF GOODS ACT 1979

The following is an extract from the Sale of Goods Act 1979:

“Section 12 Implied terms about title, etc

- (1) In a contract of sale, other than one to which subsection (3) below applies, there is an implied term on the part of the seller that in the case of a sale he has a right to sell the goods, and in the case of an agreement to sell he will have such a right at the time when the property is to pass.
- (2) In a contract of sale, other than one to which subsection (3) below applies, there is also an implied term that-
  - (a) the goods are free, and will remain free until the time when the property is to pass, from any charge or encumbrance not disclosed or known to the buyer before the contract is made, and
  - (b) the buyer will enjoy quiet possession of the goods except in so far as it may be disturbed by the owner or other person entitled to the benefit of any charge or encumbrance so disclosed or known.
- (3) This subsection applies to a contract of sale in the case of which there appears from the contract or is to be inferred from its circumstances an intention that the seller should transfer only such title as he or a third person may have.
- (4) In a contract to which subsection (3) above applies there is an implied term that all charges or encumbrances known to the seller and not known to the buyer have been disclosed to the buyer before the contract is made.
- (5) In a contract to which subsection (3) above applies there is also an implied term that none of the following will disturb the buyer's quiet possession of the goods, namely:
  - (a) the seller;
  - (b) in a case where the parties to the contract intend that the seller should transfer only such title as a third person may have, that person;
  - (c) anyone claiming through or under the seller or that third person otherwise than under a charge or encumbrance disclosed or known to the buyer before the contract is made.

- (5A) As regards England and Wales and Northern Ireland, the term implied by subsection (1) above is a condition and the terms implied by subsections (2), (4) and (5) above are warranties.”
